SEATTLE, Wash., May 26.—(U. P.)—The piece de resistance of coast track and field athletics will be served May 27 when the Pacific Coast and Northwest fans will gather here for the joint coast conference and Northwest conference meets in the stadium. This meet will be the culmination of one of the most successful track seasons the coast has experienced in years. Practically every school and college in both conferences has developed a strong team, with the University of Washington and the University of California regarded as high favorites. Both Stanford and California, however, will have their star performers and coaches in the east, competing in the L. C. A. A. A. meet at Cambridge, on this date.

Records in Danger At Big Cambridge College Track Meet

BOSTON, May 26.—(U. P.)—Swarthy colored, sun-baked hands from the far west were waving with hypnotic gestures in front of the east as the greatest of America's college athletes got ready for the first day of the forty-sixth annual intercollegiate track and field championships, at the Cambridge Stadium.

Pleased with the taste of last year's championship, the Pacific Coast, in the desire for another title, sent California, last year's champions, and Stanford, two of the strongest of the many star teams gathered here for the annual classic.

"If California doesn't repeat, Stanford will win. We'll finish first and second either way," the California contingent boasted and there was no strong rebuttal from the east.

Pennsylvania, Princeton, Cornell, Harvard, Dartmouth, Penn State and Georgetown have strong combinations, but the points will be split so many ways that there seems little chance to head off the well balanced combinations from the coast.

Among all the Olympic world and oval champions that will compete, perhaps none will draw the attention of "Tiny" Hartranft, the sensational Stanford shot-putter, discus thrower and sprinter. He is within inches of the world's record in the shot and discus, and although he carries over 200 pounds, he can do ten seconds in the century. He is counted upon as the biggest individual point scorer of the meet.

Several world's records may be broken and it is almost a certainty that many intercollegiate marks will be shattered.

Kirksey, Stanford; LeConey, Lafayette, and Lovjoy, Cornell, are consistent 9 and 4-5 men in the hundred yards and on the Harvard track, which is about the fastest in the world, one of the three may jump out into the Paddock class.

Larry Brown, Pennsylvania captain, is going out for a record in the quarter and the half and if he beats the field lined up against him, he will have to better the present mark. Alton Woodring, Syracuse star and Olympic 200 meter champion, might set a new mark in the 220-yard dash if he is in form.

The shot, discus and javelin records are in dire danger.

Jack Marchant, California star, probably will establish a new distance in the hammer throw.

Nothing like the present assemblage of talent has ever appeared in the intercollegiate and tickets are in such demand that a new attendance mark may be set.
