Senator McCumber today said he would not call up the measure until he had an understanding that there would be no filibuster against it.

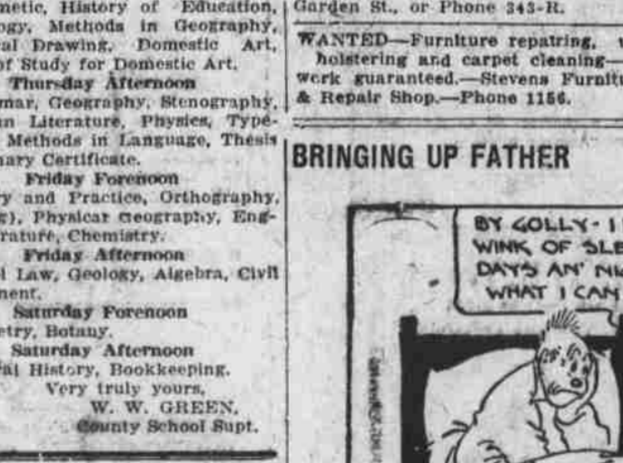
