One Girl Saved Six Hundred

CONSTANTINOPLE, (Special correspondence to United Press).—Miss Anna L. Daniels, one of the first young women from America to volunteer for relief work in the Near East, will return to America shortly, after having personally saved six hundred children in three years. Since early in 1919, she has been at Trebizand, the ancient caravan terminus on the Black Sea, aiding in collecting orphan children from war-destroyed villages and stragglers found on the camel highways after prolonged wanderings. "The work is not finished, but I am returning for a rest," Miss Daniels told a correspondent who visited Trebizand recently. "The work must go on if America will give for it. To my mind, the care and education of the war orphan is the most important of the things American relief service is doing." Miss Daniels is the daughter of the late Charles H. Daniels, of Framingham, Mass., who was the home secretary of the American Board of Foreign Missions. Her mother, who resides now at Tolland, Conn., is president of the Women's Board of Foreign Missions.

AMERICANS FIGURE IN NEW PLAYS AT GERMAN THEATERS

BERLIN, June 13.—(U. P.)—The German opera poets are turning more and more toward America for new ideas. A new play, much applauded, is "Inn of Love." The main figure is an American, hunting for liquor.

The German press and the man on the street seem to think that is the chief occupation of the American these days, when he is not scheming to rob some more or less innocent foreigner.

Along the latter line is the new operetta, called "Girls of Davos." It is at the Central Theater, in Berlin. This Smith millionaire therefore yields to his daughter's plea, gives her the Swiss, with his blessing and 50 per cent of the stock in the Company which is to make the motor. Nothing is said about any harvest stock.

Their louder cheers. Perhaps they are cheering the idea not so much American money coming to Europe.
