Volcanoes to Run Sugar Mills

HONOLULU, (By Mail to United Press)—Boring with a giant churn drill into the Kilauea on the island of Hawaii was begun a few days ago.

The purpose is to attempt to pipe and utilize either the steam or gas of the volcano for industrial purposes, especially for furnishing power for the island's many sugar mills.

Steam heated to 90 degrees centigrade was struck ten feet down. Further drilling is proceeding in order to try to tap steam under enough pressure to make it commercially useful.

If volcanic force can be used for industrial purposes, Hawaii will come close to having free power, and a new approach will have been made to "perpetual motion."

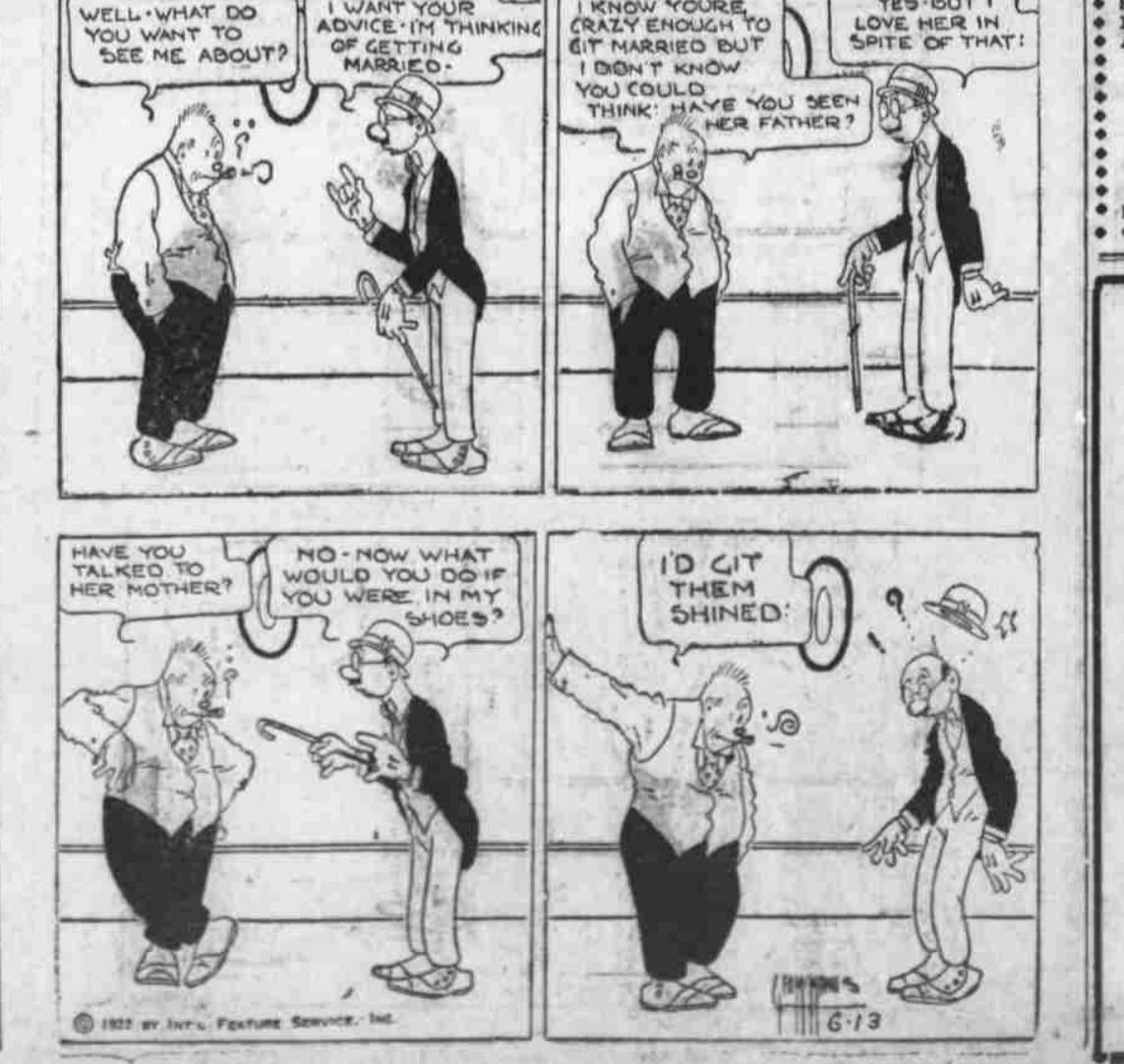
