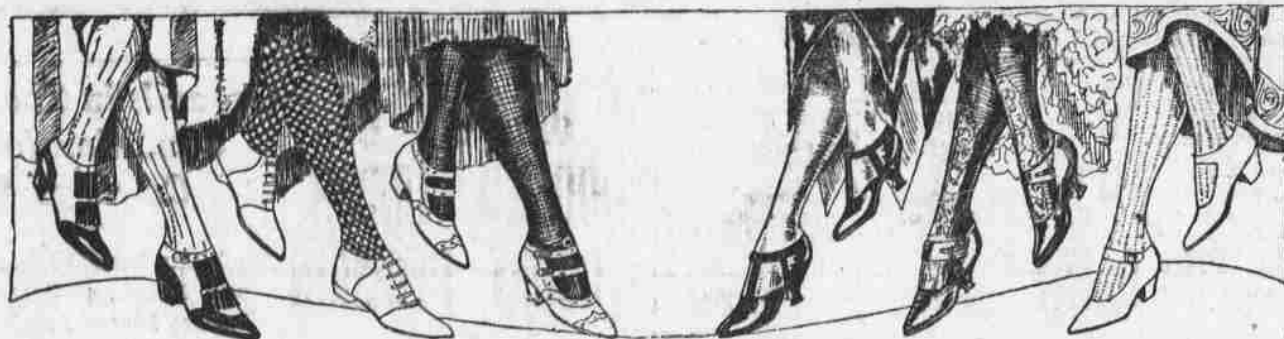

PRESSES CAN'T PRINT MONEY FAST ENOUGH TO CATCH SOURING PRICES

MOSCOW. (By mail to United Press)—Prices of food and clothing increased 750 per cent in Moscow during the first ten weeks of 1922, according to official statistics just published. They are still going up, faster than ever, largely due to the fall in value of the paper rouble.

Rapidly as the government money printing presses are working, they are running a losing race with the high cost of living. The government has not been able to publish roubles fast enough to make up for their decrease in purchasing value.

Figures for December, 1921, show that while the quantity of paper money in circulation was increased 85 per cent during that one month, prices went up 100 per cent on the Moscow market.

Price tags in the store windows on Arbat and Kuznetski Most not infrequently grow to twice their size in the course of a single week. Housewives, trying to estimate their household budgets more than a few days in advance, are at their wits' ends. Merchants, especially provincial buyers, are confronted with a problem that in more than a few cases has meant bankruptcy.

The rapid drop of the paper rouble has created a commercial and economic situation without precedent in world economic history.

Sensational as were the chutes of the Austrian crown and the German mark on foreign bourses, they never dropped in actual purchasing value inside the countries themselves with anything even approaching the rate of the Russian rouble during the last four months.

Wildcat Speculation

Without any stable medium of exchange the Moscow market has been converted into a wildcat field of speculation, in which the spoils go to the lucky and the quick.

In paying their employees, of course, both the government and private firms have been obliged to shift to a theoretical gold basis. Salaries are reckoned in so many gold roubles per month, the actual amount of paper roubles varying according to the average rate during the month, or week, as the period may be.

From the employees' point of view, this has partly compensated for the skyrocketing of prices, as salaries increased with every drop of the paper rouble, millions of which have been poured into circulation weekly through the various government departments.

But rapid as salaries were "hiked," the price has always managed to keep a little ahead, forcing the ultimate consumer to make up the difference as best he could—by selling personal belongings or speculating.

The disturbing effect of the constantly shifting prices upon business in general, however, could not be eliminated by any hypothetical figuring in gold roubles. Bookkeeping has become a literal nightmare.

Long time contracts, of course, have been rendered out of the question. All business has been reduced to a series of quick "grab it on the wing" deals. Business men in Moscow are holding all their capital either in nonperishable products or foreign currency—principally American dollars and English pounds. Even the German mark is used by perhaps one-third, according to recent estimates, it being terra firma itself, compared with the Soviet rouble.

Advance of Prices

During the period, Jan. 1 to March 15 flour increased 300 per cent; bread, 400; meat, 700; butter, 600; potatoes, 700; sugar, 400; shoes, 1,000; soap, 900; tobacco, 400.

Milk, however, and kerosene went up only 200 per cent.

Matches are also at the bottom of the list, having increased only 200 per cent.

Five months ago one could ride three or four hours in a drosky for 100,000 roubles. Now it costs 500,000 just to climb in and very few rides are short enough to be made for less than a million.

Last fall the best seat in the opera could be had for 35,000 roubles. Today an average "parterre" (rear half of the ground floor) brings a million, and the best places sell for two million.

TOKIO, June 17.—Japan may be the first country to follow the United States into the age of corn whiskey and home brew. It won't be very soon but the movement to deprive the "raskas" man and the geisha of their "saké" and those who have acquired western culture of their beer and Scotch whiskey has started.

The W. C. T. U. and other organizations, similar to those which consider a cocktail a crime in America, are interested. They have been doing prohibition work for years, but it was not until recently that the campaign started with force. Encouragement by the passage of the minor prohibition law by the diet is responsible for the activity, and now one sees groups of girls and women with an occasional man on prominent street corners handing to passers-by circulars telling of the evils of drink.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., June 17.—Automobile poker has become so popular in Sharpsburg, a suburb, that a lot of the young men of the town have recently devoted more time to the latest in gambling than they have to their work. In fact, the

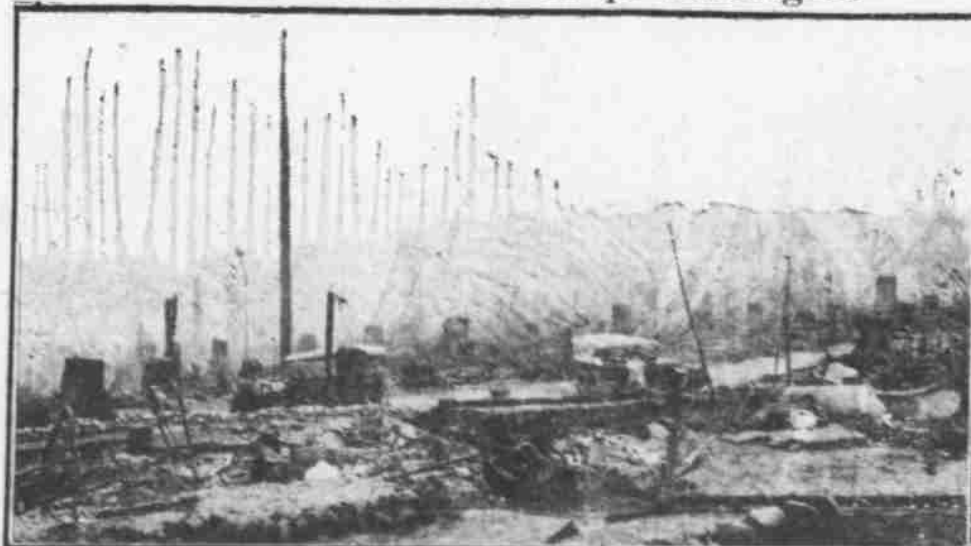
the first seven or eight cars that pass a given point, the player whose car has the best poker hand winning.
