Killers Hammer Lamb Market At Portland

(From The Oregon Journal.) Five of the 18 loads of livestock reported in the North Portland alley Tuesday came forward to late Monday to be included in the days report. Hogs were slow and inclined to weaken. Cattle ruled nominally steady, while sheep were slow and weak at further price reductions.

Market for cattle, while considered steady by some, is in reality depressed at a further price reduction for the stuff, bulls and for calves. Only a nominal supply came forward to North Portland for the Tuesday trade, but there was little demand in sight.

Four loads of Colorado hogs came for the open market at North Portland, these being among the first arrivals from that district. In general the swine division at North Portland is inclined to show a very slow movement, with prices inclined weak.

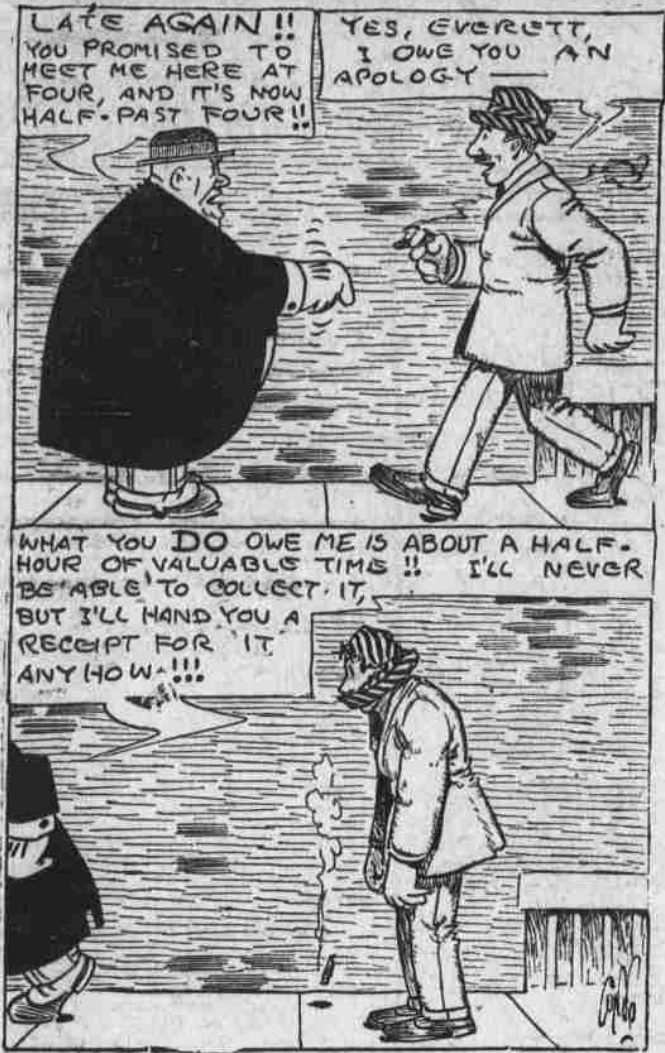
