Mr. and Mrs. Revella Lientallen and Frank Whitey motored to Walla Walla to attend the ball game.

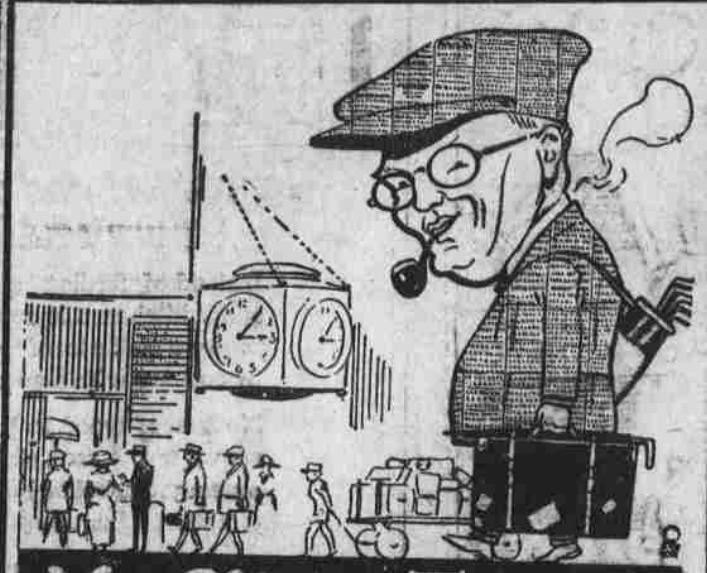
