'BELLED BUZZARD' FRIGHTENS WEST VIRGINIA PEOPLE

MARLINTON, W. Va., July 21.—(L. N. S.)—Many of the superstitious residents of Monroe, Mercer and Pocahontas counties fear a disaster is close at hand in which there will be a great loss of life. To back up this claim they declare that the "belled" buzzard is again hovering over the hills of these counties and that this is an evil omen. The "belled" buzzard, according to pioneer residents, is more than one hundred years old and its appearance in the past has been an omen of serious consequences. The old timers point out that for three months prior to the Cabin Creek strike several years ago the buzzard circled about in that region. Soon afterward there was a heavy loss of life by floods. On other occasions when there have been incidents which took a heavy toll of lives the buzzard was to be seen. The most notable appearance in recent times was just before the labor troubles in "bloody" Mingo County.

the party, told some of the experiences on the long 2000 mile drive but did not enter into discussion of the main subject before the meeting. W. O. Staver in behalf of the large Pilot Rock delegation present, argued for help on the road.

Cecil Arouses Hope

District Forester Cecil though not travelling with the party chanced to be in the city last evening and attended the session. The fate of the road now seems to depend on the extent to which the state commission will encourage use of federal money to the road. It appears useless to expect state aid regardless of the fact the road is on the state map and Umatilla county has had \$85,000 of bond money available for work for some years past. The fact that the road is part of the old original route from the inland empire to California, classed as the shortest and best winter route, may be handicapping the project some. The feeling prevails that Portland tourist boosters want no encouragement given to a road that might ultimately route people to California without going through Portland.

Additional members of the highway party included R. H. Seidock, district engineer, the secretary of the commission, John W. Kelley, representing the Portland Oregonian, R. H. Johnson, the Journal and Harry C. Frye, the Portland Telegram. The party has been travelling early and late over all sorts of roads and the grind has been a hard one. The meeting last evening did not conclude until 11 o'clock and it was not until then that the commission announced they would journey south this morning. On leaving here they intended to go to the north fork and then return to Heppner. Reports received by phone from Ukiah show however that on passing there the party had in mind to go on to Ritter and to Heppner from that point. Members of the county court and Roadmaster Shannon accompanied the party south this morning.
