PORTLAND STRIKERS HELD FOR ASSAULT

PORTLAND, July 21.—(A. P.)—Four strikers had been arrested here today charged with attacks upon non-union shop workers. A woman whose husband and son work in the shops reported windows in her house broken.

FIREFIGHTERS HURTL LOG JAM TO SAFETY

PORTLAND, July 21.—(A. P.)—Fifteen fire fighters at Herman creek escaped injury and possible death by hobbling themselves over a burning log jam at the moment when the wind carried the flames from one end of the jam after they were surrounded by flames and were forced to spend an hour in the creek, according to a story brought here today. The fire fighters were extending a fire line along the ridge from Benson plateau to check the flames.

CHILE AND PERU WILL ARBITRATE DISPUTE

WASHINGTON, July 21.—(A. P.)—An agreement of Chile and Peru to arbitrate the Tacna-Arica controversy was signed by plenipotentiaries of the two governments today at the final session of the Chilean-Peruvian conference. The agreement to settle the ancient dispute by arbitration was hailed by Secretary Hughes in a speech at the closing session of the conference on a sweeping victory for "the conference plan of international negotiation." He declared the settlement as the greatest accomplishment of a generation in the direction of peace in the western hemisphere.

RYAN IN BANKRUPTCY WITH MILLION DOLLARS

NEW YORK, July 21.—(A. P.)—Allen A. Ryan, prominent wall street broker, son of Thomas Fortune Ryan, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy today. His liabilities are approximately \$22,500,000 and his assets exceeding \$1,000,000. Two years ago he figured in the famous corner of Stutz.

BORAH WANTS PROBE INTO COAL TROUBLES

WASHINGTON, July 21.—(U. P.)—Senator Borah intends shortly to initiate a sweeping congressional investigation to determine the cause and fix the blame for the coal strike with the ultimate purpose of enacting legislation to prevent future coal wars. The senate interstate commerce commission last night started conferences with rail executives to bring about settlement of the rail strike.

SUBSTATION MEN DID NOT STAGE WALKOUT

PORTLAND, July 21.—(U. P.)—Substation men of the Southern Pacific and Spokane, Portland and Seattle electric suburban lines out of Portland failed to strike this morning as scheduled. They will await a more perfect organization of their strike forces before walking out, union organizers intimated.

LIMERICK SITUATION IS REPORTED VERY GRAVE

DUBLIN, July 21.—(A. P.)—A message from Nenagh, passed by the military censor reported the Limerick situation is very grave. Over 20 have been killed and 40 wounded in the fighting here.

HOME DEMONSTRATION IDEAS FOR HOUSEWIVES

- Potato Chips**
Potatoes are a universal article for a diet and their manufacture into potato chips to be used for lunches and picnics is entirely feasible.
- High grade cotton seed oil**
heated to 210 degrees C or 400 degrees F is the best fat in which to fry them. Vegetable oils or compounds are much more satisfactory than animal fats. The potatoes that are sliced through a vegetable slicer give best results as it is almost impossible to cut potatoes thinly and evenly enough by hand. A deep vessel made of iron or steel with an inner perforated basket is best for frying. Use mature potatoes high in starch and of large or medium size. Soaking the potatoes for a short time in cold water adds to the crispness. They should be thoroughly wiped before putting into the frying basket.—V. D.

Dust For Cucumber Beetles
The 12-spotted cucumber beetle or bean beetle is doing serious injury to various truck and garden crops, particularly beans and potatoes. Probably the most advisable control practice of this time would be use of dust application, mixing 1 part of arsenate of lead with 9 parts of air slaked lime sifted wood ashes or a similar dust carrier. Place material in cheese cloth bag or salt sock and dust lightly over plants to be protected. This is best done in the early morning when there is no wind.—O. A. C. Experiment Station.
