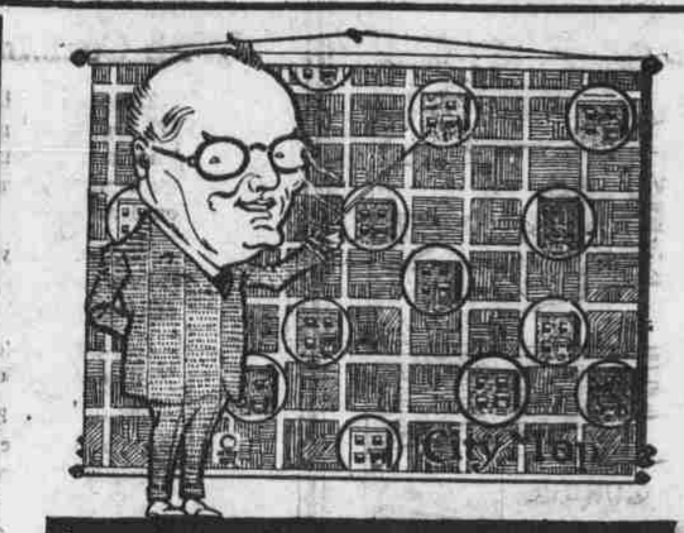
To-Day's Blunder Corrected
