### FOREST FIRES GET BLAME FOR WRECKS

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 18.—(U. P.)—Regardless of what reasons may be assigned by survey boards and underwriters, sea-faring folks hereabouts maintain that Puget Sound's recent string of accidents is due solely to the misadventure of the condition of the atmosphere because of forest fires which have smoldered among the coastal forests all summer.

Four major disasters have happened in and off the sound within the last two months. In each case investigating officers complained of smoke and fog, but principally smoke.

On July 16 the steam schooner Henry T. Scott was rammed by the big freighter Harry Luckenbach in a smoke pall off Neah Bay, Straits Juan de Fuca. Four lives were lost.

On the same day the steamer Mobile City lost its way in a smoke fog, and was stranded on Protection Island. The vessel was extricated from its predicament and it is good as ever.

The steamer Calista, a Puget Sound passenger-ferry steamer, was sunk off West Point, 3 miles from Seattle, on July 2 when the vision of the lookout on board the Japanese passenger steamer Hawaii Maru was obscured by fog and smoke. The Hawaii Maru rammed the Calista amidship but all were rescued.

On August 4 the fast and luxurious coastal liner H. P. Alexander, formerly the Great Northern, and with a war and peace record as long as her log line, struck on Cape Hoek, the base

**POSTAL BUSINESS IN U. S. GROWING RAPIDLY**  
 WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—To the beginning of the present fiscal year the post office department had added thirty five new first class post offices to its list, bringing the total number of first-class offices to 834, according to First Assistant Postmaster-General Bartlett.

This has resulted in an increase in the pay roll of \$112,000, the new first-class postmasters each receiving a salary of \$3,200 a year, Bartlett said.
