This statement was confirmed today by comparative figures made of the post office department upon the weight of the average letter that goes through the mail.

Back in 1907, on the average that there were 40 pieces of first class mail to every pound.

Now the same data shows that there are 45 pieces of first class mail to every pound. This means that the weight of the average letter is less, and, therefore, shorter.
