

## WILLIAM P. REMINGTON EASTERN OREGON BISHOP

PORTLAND, Sept. 21.—(A. P.)—William Proctor Remington has been elected missionary bishop for Eastern Oregon diocese for the Protestant Episcopal church. He was formerly Suffragan Bishop of South Dakota. Remington is a famous athlete and was ordained a priest in 1906. He held posts in Philadelphia and Minneapolis, Minnesota. He was consecrated bishop of South Dakota January 10, 1918 and was chaplain of a base hospital twenty-six. He is a member of the board of missions of the Protestant Episcopal church. Remington was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, March 13, 1879 and was married to Florence Lyman Allen at Burlington, Vermont, September 2, 1905. He is regarded as one of the most brilliant of the younger Episcopal bishops.
