ed from 1-s to 1-4.
Total subscriptions for the new is sue probably will reach \$1,500,000,000, according to officials of the local federal reserve bank. This estimate was based, in part, on an inquiry made among large New York institutions, which are expected to have subscribed for a major part of the offering.




