ENGLISH WOMEN URGED TO GIVE UP CIGARETTE

LONDON, Nov. 21.—(A. P.)—English physicians are urging women who are addicted to smoking, to use a pipe and good tobacco instead of the cigarette. The doctors point out that the nicotine found in the cheaper brands of cigarettes is much more injurious to women than to men, and they declare that the perfumes and scents used in brands prepared for the fair sex also are injurious.

Two recent deaths of women have been attributed directly to cigarette smoking. While these cases have been due to excessive smoking, the physicians say that the same amount of pipe smoking probably would not have had fatal results.

Smoking among women in London is now almost universal, and one rarely goes to a theatre, dance or restaurant where the majority of the women present are not smoking.

Recently two young women appeared at an athletic meet smoking pipes, and many of the fashionable shops of Bond Street have exhibited stocks of pipes designed for the feminine smoker. However, the innovation has made little progress, and cigarettes are still the favorite.

RATTLER FOUND NEAR CHICAGO; CAPTURED

CHICAGO, Nov. 21.—The oft-debated question of whether rattlers grow wild in the vicinity of Chicago has been settled by Dr. Frank M. Woodruff, curator of the Chicago Academy of Sciences, in Lincoln Park, with the acquisition of a specimen captured this summer in the sand dunes at Miller Beach, near Gary, Ind.

The rattler, a three foot female with six rattlers and a button, belongs to the prairie type, or Crotalus Souleianus. Shortly after reaching the museum she gave birth to seven young snakes. Two died, one escaped, and the other four, now some six or eight inches long, already have demonstrated on white mice that they are as deadly venomous as their mother.

After completing a study of the habits of the mother and her young, Dr. Woodruff plans to dispatch them and make plaster casts for the exhibit of rattlers from the environs of Chicago.

STOCK FORESTS WITH MOOSE

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 21.—(A. P.)—In an effort to stock the forests of Oregon with moose, five of these animals, brought from Alaska, were liberated by the state game commission a few days ago in the southern part of Lane county and the northern part of Douglas county, near the Pacific ocean. It is said that conditions in this part of Oregon are ideal for raising moose. Members of the game commission assert the belief that in a few years there will be large herd of moose in that locality. The moose that have just been liberated as a foundation for a herd are protected by state law.
