TOKIO THIRD IN SIZE IN CITIES OF WORLD

TOKIO, Nov. 21.—(A. P.)—Tokio has become Greater Tokio with a population of 5,164,000 people and an area of 161.1 square miles. Tokio therefore comes third among the capitals of the world with a million and a half more people within the city limits than Paris or Berlin. New York ranks second and London first. Twenty four villages and suburbs have been included in the greater city. The expansion has taken the form of a great circle, the Imperial Palace being almost in the center. The radius is nearly 10 English miles.
 Viscount Goto, the mayor of Tokio, has in view the construction of modern roads, long lacking in the capital, improvement of the tramcar lines and the creation of a great harbor where ocean liners can call.
 In old times Tokio was called Yedo and was but a fishing village. The Shogun Tokugawa Iyeyasu chose it for his capital in 1590.
