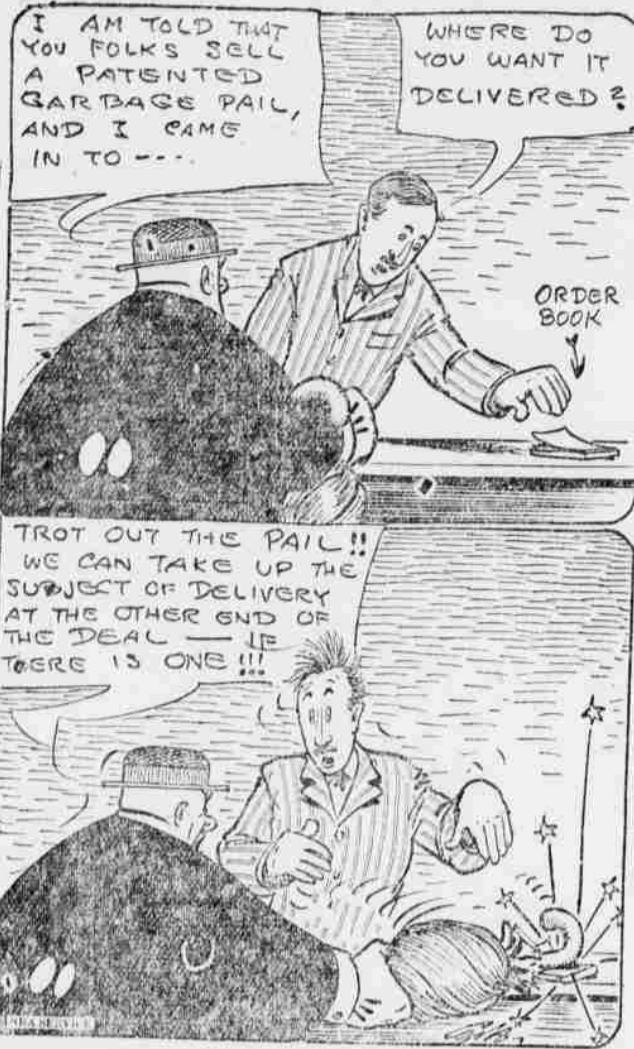
## Hog Market Sags

Slightly At Portland  
(From The Oregon Journal.)  
They showed a tinge of weakness at the Friday opening, although only a nominal supply came forward for the open market. Cattle were just holding, while sheep and lambs rallied steady. Run included 33 cars of which the bulk of the supplies went direct to killers and did not enter the market. In the hog alley, out of the total of 272 head for the day, 2800 head went direct to local killers and 252 head went through to other cities.

These came from the Midwest on previous purchase there.  
Early hog market was practically all at North Portland. Bids at the start were 25c below the previous range.

Speculatives Sold  
Male Bonds Irregular  
NEW YORK, Dec. 9.—(A. P.)—Heavy selling of some of the speculative railroad mortgages for location purposes, combined with better buying a power in foreign and United States government securities gave yesterday's bond market an irregular amount of business being transacted.  
St. Paul issues were again in free supply, the refunding 1-1-25 breaking 2 3-8 points; the general 4-1-25, 1-3-4 and the convertible 4-1-25, 1-1-2. Frisco income 6s and Erie convertible 2s series A, also were sold heavily, each dropping 1 3-4 points, while nearly a dozen other active low-priced issues dropped a point each. There were a few strong spots, however, notably Central New England 4s, which jumped 3 points and "800" 4-1-25, Toledo, St. Louis & Western 4s and Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago & St. Louis 4s, all up more than a point.
