

TURKISH OIL FIELDS BECOME PRODUCTIVE

LONDON, Dec. 13.—(A. P.)—The approaching Anglo-French-American agreement regarding the Mosul oil fields in Asiatic Turkey, brings to an end the negotiations which have been in abeyance for two years and which have been of international interest.

The Germans were the first to interest themselves in the possibilities of these fields, taking up the matter early in this century. The German prospectors, however, took care to make two reports of their discovery, sending one to their own government, in which they referred to the oil fields, and the other to the sultan's government in which the same opportunities were said to be very meagre. The then sultan, Abdul Hamid, managed to obtain copies of both reports. Convinced his resentment from the Germans, he had the reports from Mosul transferred from the State Department of Mines to his own Civil

List, in order better to bargain with former Emperor William. The negotiations dragged on for many years. Meanwhile the D'Arcy exploration of the same field was carried out, and two years before the war the much desired concession was obtained by an international syndicate, the Turkish Petroleum company. The Germans obtained 25 per cent of the stock of the company and English interests the other 75 per cent.

Under the San Remo oil convention of 1920, the German interests were transferred to France. Last year, however, the American government disputed the claim of the English interests, but in the end merely asked the right to share in the enterprise. The amount of interest allotted to the Americans under the new agreement is not known, but it will probably be only a nominal percentage of the British and French interests.

Regarding the other Iraq oil fields, American and all powers of the League of Nations are given equal opportunities. No prospecting so far has taken place.

SILK PRODUCTION TO REVIVE ON ISLANDS

MANILA, P. I., Dec. 13.—The production of silk in the Philippine Islands for export to Hedy to be revived in the near future after being abandoned for about 70 years in the opinion of Dr. Charles S. Fernald, former entomologist in U. S. Bureau of Science in Manila, who has returned from Nueva Apolonia, province of Oriental Negros, where he supervised the planting of a large tract in mulberry trees and where he says a superior grade of silk is being produced on a smaller scale.

"At Nueva Apolonia, conditions are in every way suited to the industry," said Dr. Fernald. "The climate is cool because of the altitude, 1500 feet above sea level, and the silk worms produce eight generations a year. They are free from all disease and grow to an unusual size."

The chief handicap under which the silk industry has labored in the past in the Philippines has been the lack of initiative in the planting of mulberry trees in sufficient quantity to enable the raising of silk worms in commercial quantities. At Nueva Apolonia, we have some forty acres of mulberry trees and are producing silk that is superior to the grades that for many years have been imported from China and sold at a high price. Mechanical reeling will be installed at the plantation and thousands of mulberry trees are to be planted every month."

Nearly 150 years ago silk worm culture was taken up in the Philippines and the silk industry grew to considerable proportions under about 70 years ago when it was virtually abandoned, because of a lack of laborers, according to some authorities.

There are but two ends to a crook's career, the gray dawn of death or the "broad daylight" of reason. Seldom, it points out, does this white light of reason strike the erring.

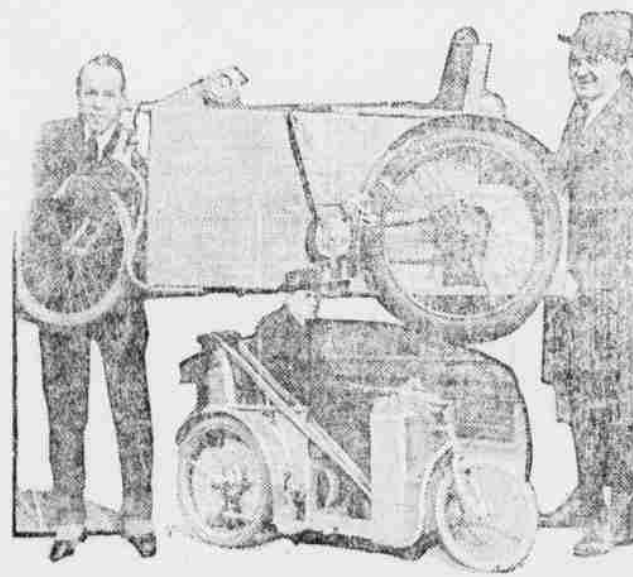
