MODERN FRENCH SUBWAY

PARIS, Dec. 13.—Part of the new subway from the Trocadero to Boulevard Haussmann is now open. The new stations are much brighter than the old ones. The trains on this new line may be dispatched every minute and three-quarters, which is fifteen seconds faster than any other line in Paris. The cars are fitted with telephones, in case of a tie-up the terminals may be notified at once and help sent out.

INTERURBAN AIR ROUTE.

ROME, Dec. 13.—(U. S. S.)—The Italian authorities are considering a scheme to link up the principal cities of Italy by air.

Big two-deck planes will be used if the scheme takes shape and comes into effect.

BUCKAREST, Dec. 13.—(A. P.)—The question of the nationalization of the sub-soil in Rumania, which is in effect the problem of whether the unexploited mine-bearing formation shall be declared the property of the state, will shortly be taken before the national assembly as a result of the investigation of the commission for reform of the constitution.

The final decision of the assembly is awaited with interest, as it will effect the rights of the various oil interests to exploit the vast Rumanian oil fields.

The idea of nationalizing the sub-soil was advanced by M. Vintila Bratiano, minister of finance, and has met with much opposition from all parties. The nature of the report to be made by the commission is not known, but opponents of the measure threaten to defeat the government should it be favorable to M. Bratiano's policy.
