NEWS HAPPENINGS OF THE NORTHWEST

Salem Boosts Dairy Business.

The dairying industry in the Salem district is growing—it doubled in 1921 over 1920, and it has doubled in three years in Polk county.

But there is room for much greater growth—for ten or twenty or more good cows for every one here now; and the faster it increases in volume the better for the whole district—the better for the fertility of the soil for the production of all crops; the better for the monthly incomes of the producers of this district; the better for all concerned.

And Salem can handle all the increase.

Salem has two splendid and progressive concerns for the marketing and hauling of all the dairy products that this section can furnish now or in the future.

The Marion Creamery and Produce company is now paying out at the rate of about \$1,000,000 a year to the dairymen of the country around-

ing Salem; and they now have facilities for making it much more than a million; including the condensing of the milk, the making of the cream into butter, and even the making of cheese.

The Capital City Cooperative creamery is owned by dairymen and managed by dairymen, and it has facilities to handle all the offerings, and to make the highest possible returns.

Both of these Salem institutions are prepared to lend every sort of help and encouragement for the increase of the milk supply of this section.—Salem Statesman.

Discuss Umatilla Rapids Project.

Fifty men enjoyed a fine chicken dinner at Hotel Heppner last evening, the occasion being the regular Brotherhood meeting. The Umatilla Rapids Power project was the subject of discussion and Judge Phelps, of Pendleton, president of the association behind the project, was the principal speaker. He brought out the fact that the project has three phases—development of cheap power, reclamation of a big area of desert land by irrigation and water transportation. F. A. McMenamin, W. O. Livingstone and Roy Pickens took issue with some of the other speakers to the extent of pointing out some of the difficulties and obstacles in the way of carrying out the project as usually outlined.—Heppner Herald.

Bold Thief Gets Away With Deer.

What Game Warden A. R. Johnson considers almost unparalleled audacity was evidenced Tuesday night shortly after 5 o'clock when some person stole from the pavement in front of the Anderson, Bolick & Kalkvannough store a deer carcass placed on exhibition there by the fish and game department of the state of Idaho as an object lesson in the depredations of timber cutters upon deer.

The deer, which had been in the window of the store during most of the day had been placed outside to freeze for further use, but disappeared almost immediately after it was left. It is assumed that some person who wanted the meat, slipped the carcass into a car standing near the curb and whisked it away unobserved, despite the seeming difficulty with which this could have been accomplished.

The game warden said last night that the deer was the property of the state fish and game department, and, moreover, that the person who took it was in the illegal possession of a deer. The matter has been turned over to the sheriff, who will assist Mr. Johnson in a search. The latter has almost unlimited authority of search and arrest in the carrying out of his duty and his industry and persistence in apprehending violators of game laws is well known. While the carcass thief may not be known, it is certain that his tracks will have been well covered if they escape the vigilance of the game warden, particularly when supplemented by the activity of Sheriff Welker's corps.—Lewiston Tribune.

La Grande Will Prevent Loafing

Evidence was produced at the meeting of the city commission last night containing the names of about forty boys under eighteen years of age who have been in the habit of frequenting pool halls and card rooms as loafing places and places of amusement, among them being many school boys who are said to regularly spend as much time as they have to spare in the above named places. Clint Hansen, chief of police, will be acquainted with the list and will deal sharply with both the establishments in question and with the boys who violate the ordinance.—La Grande Observer.

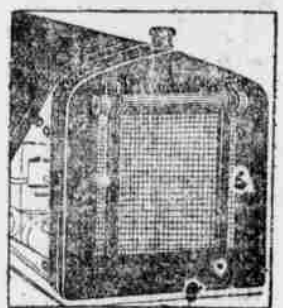
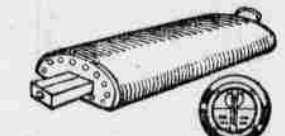

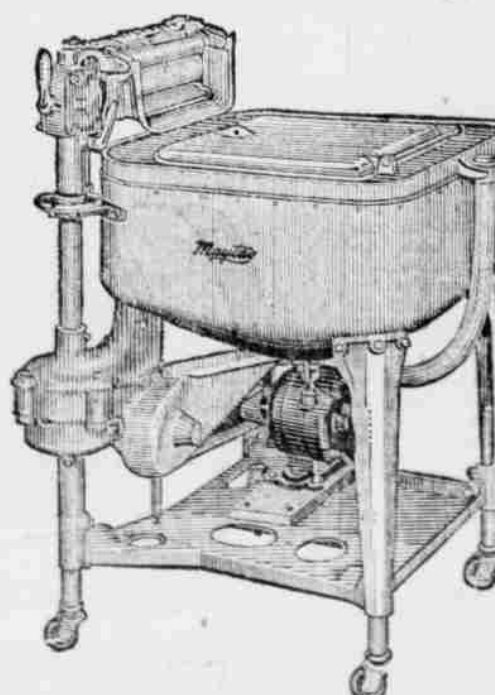
