### Drugs, alcohol no factor in Linfield student's slaying

McMINNVILLE (AP) — Drug and alcohol tests on the body of the killer don't shed any light on the deadly and unexplained stabbing of a Linfield College student last year, authorities say.

The results show that a tree farm worker never known to be violent was not drunk or high when he walked into a convenience store and stabbed Parker Moore, a Linfield College student he'd never met.

The Nov. 15 stabbing has baffled investigators, who haven't uncovered a motive and say they may never know why it happened. KGW-TV reported. They say there was no confrontation between Moore and his killer.

Police fatally shot the killer, Juventino Bermudez Arenas, 33, after he returned to the store.

Officers said he advanced on them with a kitchen knife, and witnesses confirmed their account. Family members said Arenas was a Spanish speaker who had told them he was returning to the store to surrender.

Recently completed toxicology tests showed Arenas had a blood-alcohol content of 0.01 percent, said Yamhill County District Attorney Brad Berry. He called that figure unremarkable. The level at which a driver is presumed drunk is 0.08 percent.

The post-mortem testing also ruled out "common drugs of abuse" and pharmaceuticals such as oxycodone, methadone, hydrocodone and anti-depressants, Berry said.

Arenas was in the country illegally and lived with family members in a home near the 7-Eleven store, said Yamhill County sheriff's Capt. Tim Svenson.

He had just one minor infraction on his criminal

record and was working as a laborer at a tree farm, Svenson said.

The store is across the street from the main entrance to the Linfield College campus, where Moore, 20, lived.

### Man arrested in hotel slaying

PORTLAND (AP) — A Washington state man has been arrested in the killing of a 24-year-old woman last month at a Portland hotel, police said.

Tae Bum Yoon, 24, of Bellevue, Washington, was arrested Wednesday at Portland's Union Station. He pleaded not guilty to murder at a brief court appearance Friday before Multnomah County Judge John Wittmayer. Yoon remains behind bars, and his next court appearance is Jan. 20.

Police have described Ashley Renee Benson, of Vancouver, Washington, as a victim of sex trafficking but declined to say whether that was related to her killing. On Friday, police and prosecutors were still mum about the circumstances of her death and what evidence leads them to think Yoon was involved.

### Stolen bike back after online video

GRANTS PASS (AP) — A stolen bicycle has been returned to a shop in Grants Pass after the owner posted a video of the theft on Facebook.

Don's Bike Center owner Don Hendricks tells *The Grants Pass Daily Courier* the \$2,000 trail bike with oversize tires was taken from the downtown shop in a smash-and-grab at the end of December.

He says a few days later he posted a security video of the theft, and within two hours someone called to say they had an idea who might be responsible.

# BOARDMAN Woman arrested after standoff

Boardman police arrested a 25-year-old woman Thursday in the standoff with a man who barricaded himself in an apartment.

Police Chief Rick Stokoe said Friday afternoon that officers arrested Zahira Ramirez for fourth-degree domestic violence and second-degree disorderly conduct, both misdemeanors. Police booked her into the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton, which released her later the same day.

Boardman police a few minutes before noon responded to a call about a domestic disturbance at Castle Rock Apartments, 451 Tatone St., Boardman. Members of the Morrow County Sheriff's Office also responded. Stokoe said when officers arrived they

spoke with Ramirez, who claimed her boyfriend injured her, barricaded himself in their apartment and had a gun.

Stokoe said she showed signs of injury, but he did not specify what kind, and an ambulance took her to Good Shepherd Medical Center, Hermiston.

Police tried to talk to Ramirez's boyfriend, but he refused to answer the door. "If anything, I think he was afraid he was going to be arrested," Stokoe said.

Police and sheriff's deputies cleared out adjacent apartments, locked down two nearby schools and blocked off roads for more than an hour. A Pendleton Police Department SWAT unit was heading to the standoff, but Stokoe said an officer talked to the man over the phone and convinced him to come out before the tactical team arrived.

"Once we got him out and were able

to start talking to him and the other people involved, that's when we determined there was more to the story than we were hearing," the chief said.

Good Shepherd checked out Ramirez and she returned to the scene. Police questioned her, Stokoe said, and based on her statements and what others said, she was the "primary aggressor" and that led to her arrest.

Stokoe said the circumstances were confusing in the beginning, and while Boardman officers detained the man for questioning, he was not under arrest. He admitted to the officer during their phone conversation there was a gun inside the apartment, Stokoe said, but the man did not commit any crime with the weapon. However, he could still face a charge of disorderly conduct.

Stokoe said that was only a possibility and the case remains under investigation.
