Umatilla County now taking digital deeds, more

PENDLETON — Title companies, banks, attorneys and others now can submit documents electronically to Umatilla County. The county adopted electronic recording with Simplifile, the nation's largest e-recording service.

Steve Churchill, the county's chief records officer, praised the move in a written statement from Simplifile and said while he was hesitant at first, accepting e-recordings is a boon that cut down on paperwork and sped up service to customers, reducing the turnaround time for a document from a week to just minutes.

"Before e-recording," according to Churchill, "it could literally take months for a previously submitted paper document to be corrected and re-submitted."

In 2014, the office recorded 10,408 paper documents totaling more than 42,000 pages. Churchill stated he is hopeful the county can achieve a 50/50 split of e-recording versus traditional paper recording by the end of 2015.

Umatilla County is the 16th county in Oregon to adopt Simplifile's e-recording service, according to the statement, joining more than 1,800 jurisdictions nationwide. High-speed Internet access, a personal computer and a scanner are the minimum requirements for customers to begin e-recording with Simplifile.
