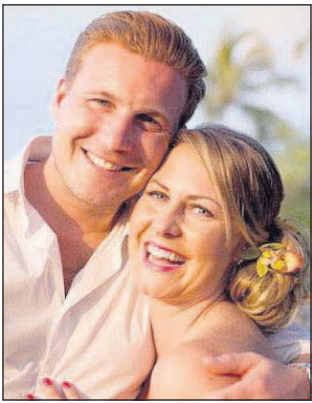
The couple will be married at Our Lady of Angels Catholic Church in Hermiston at a date to be announced.

Tough Enough To Wear Pink ropes in cash for cancer programs

A pair of area organizations cashed in with proceeds from the 2014 Tough Enough To Wear Pink during Pendleton Round-Up.

Net proceeds from the 2014 campaign were higher than they've ever been in the nine years of the event that raises money for local cancer programs. The high profile event not only raises awareness of breast cancer, but 100 percent of the proceeds stay right here in our community. The \$26,131.78 from the Sept. 11 event was divided and recently presented to **Lisa Hummell** of the St. Anthony Hospital Cancer Care Clinic and to **Deb Shampine**, coordinator of the Kick'n Cancer New Beginnings program.

The two organizations help local breast cancer patients from the time of diagnosis through recovery from cancer. The Kick'n Cancer program provides free massage, personal training and Pilates classes for recovering patients, while the St. Anthony Cancer Care Clinic provides breast prosthetics, mastectomy bras, post-op camisoles, lymphedema sleeves, pads and gloves, mastectomy swimwear, wigs, financial help and mileage reimbursement for cancer patients.

During her military career, Isa-

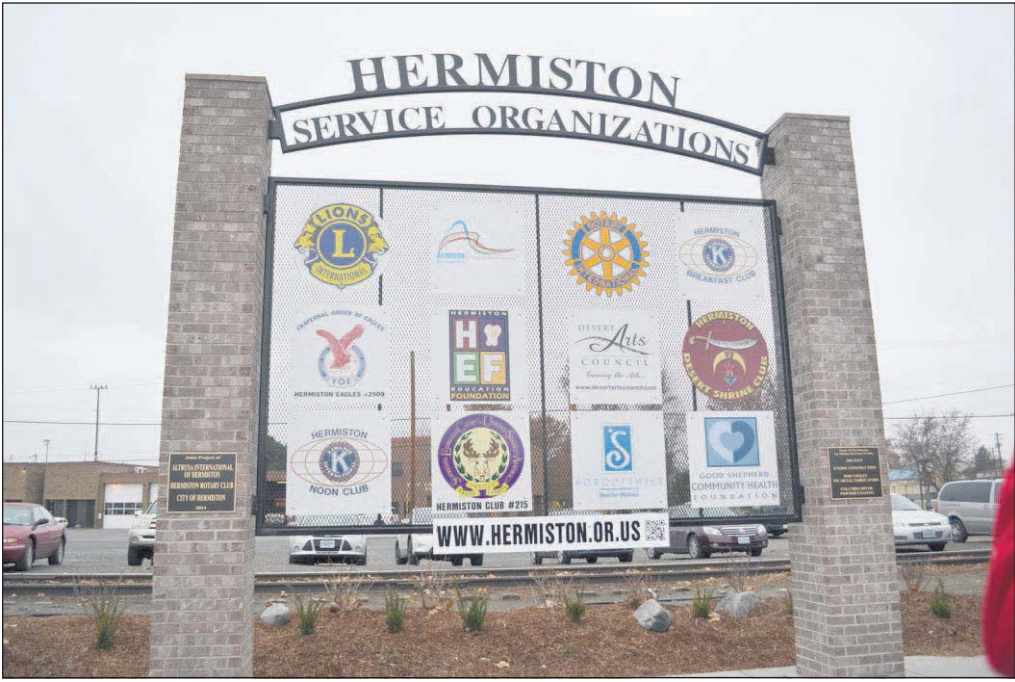
