Arts Council of Pendleton, Crow’s Shadow get grants

PENDLETON —The arts are getting a boost in Umatilla County after two Pendleton groups got a combined \$12,000 in grant money from the Oregon Arts Commission.

The commission gave out \$200,000 to 34 projects across the state for its 2015 Arts Build Communities program.

This year the Arts Council of Pendleton received \$6,000 toward creating self-guided tours of artists’ studios and the stores that display their work. According to a news release the council will use the money to create a database of Eastern Oregon artists, design and print materials for the tours and host workshops.

Crow’s Shadow Institute for the Arts was awarded \$6,195 to offer art programs to students at Nixya’awii Community School. Using the money, the institute will provide students the space, technical expertise and materials to create art projects, as well as public receptions and places to display their art.

Fishtrap, Inc. in Enterprise also received a \$7,000 grant to promote a community reading project in Wal-lowa County. This year’s Big Read will feature Luis Alberto Urrea’s “Into the Beautiful North.” Money will go toward books, school presentations, lectures, discussion potlucks and a visit from the author.

The grants are meant to be seed money to complement local investments in the arts. According to the Oregon Arts Commission, the \$200,000 it gave out this year is its biggest grant distribution yet.
