Hermiston woman charged for shoplifting \$2,000 in clothes

A Hermiston woman arrested for shoplifting Monday at a Columbia Center mall store told police she was there to get clothes for her five children, according to court documents.

Jessica M. Reddick, 31, pleaded not guilty to the new case Thursday in Benton County Superior Court.

Her trial is scheduled March 9 on charges of second-degree burglary and second-degree theft. That's the same date that previously was set for her two other theft cases.

The alleged serial shoplifter was arrested and charged with the last name of Flores-Reddick. But during a hearing earlier this week on the other cases, she told a judge she no longer uses Flores.

On Monday night, a loss prevention officer at the Macy's store on Columbia Center Boulevard stopped Reddick after she left without paying for her merchandise, documents said.

Reddick allegedly admitted to taking the goods, signed an admission of guilt form for the officer and handed over the stolen merchandise, valued at \$2,076.

Reddick told a Kennewick police officer that "she knew she had warrants in Kennewick and this was 'sort of a way to turn herself in,'" court documents said.

She said she currently was not working and needed the clothes for her family, documents said.

Reddick was banned from all Macy's stores in November because of her history.

Reddick also has two other second-degree theft cases that allege she stole \$1,387 in clothes from Sears and nearly \$900 worth of items from the Richland Target store.

She was identified as the suspect in both incidents after police released store surveillance photos of her to the public.

HERMISTON

City council to vote on settlement agreement

Hermiston will avoid a potential lawsuit if the city council approves a settlement agreement with Sallee Properties, LLC on Monday night.

Rhonda Sallee had previously threatened to sue the city for damages if it went forward with vacating part of West Ridgeway Avenue near Highway 395. The city was considering turning ownership of the south 15 feet of the road over to a hotel developer interested in building on the property south of the road.

Sallee Properties argued that reducing the 60-foot road to 45 feet would restrict access to their land and make it hard for the trucks they service at Auto Kool to get in and out.

If the city council approves a settlement agreement, however, Sallee Properties will agree not to sue. In return, it will get the northernmost five feet of the road, to address

the fact that some surveys show the Auto Kool building extends onto the right of way for Ridgeway, as well as a 15-foot-wide section of Ridgeway that extends from the back of the Auto Kool building to the railroad right of way.

On Monday the council also plans to review citizen feedback on revisions to the city charter and vote on a motion to direct staff to put the charter on the May ballot. The council will have to decide if it wants to put the charter in a single ballot measure or put two potentially controversial pieces — making the municipal judge an appointed position and changing the mayor's term from two years to four — as amendments to be voted on separately.

Before the regular city council meeting at 7 p.m., the council will hold a work session at 6 p.m. about parks and trail planning.
