Rockets take control of CBC

Pilot Rock knocks of WMHS in league showdown

PILOT ROCK — The Pilot Rock girls basketball team seized control of the Columbia Basin Conference with a 54-38 win over Weston-McEwen on Saturday in a battle of league unbeatens.

In front of a raucous mixed crowd, Madison Dave poured in a game-high 16 points to go along with 15 rebounds to lead the Rockets (9-5, 5-0 CBC) to their fifth win in a row.

McKayla Deist added 15 points and the guard led the Rockets' defensive efforts with six steals.

Pilot Rock coach Butch Wilson said the action and atmosphere was befitting of the game's significance.

"The place was packed. It might have been more Weston-McEwen than Pilot Rock (fans)," he said. "It was a better game than the scoreboard showed."

Madison Carlin had 11 points and 12 rebounds to lead the Tiger-Scots, which saw their six-game winning streak ended.

Balanced Knights knock off T-Wolves

PENDLETON — Another big night from one of the NWAC's leading scorers wasn't enough to extend the Blue Mountain women's basketball team's season-long winning streak on Saturday.

The Wenatchee Valley Knights ended the Timberwolves' NWAC East Region run at three games while snapping a three-game skid of their own with a 80-74 win at Mosby Court.

Mar'Shay Moore poured in a game-high 30 points for BMCC (10-6, 3-2 East) but the Knights (11-7, 2-3) had five players reach double digits to make up the difference.

Jillian Jacobs led them with 14 points and the Knights shot 50 percent (30 of 60) from the field. Wenatchee, which moved within a game of BMCC for third place in the East Region, also played a remarkably clean game and was whistled for just seven fouls.

That helped the Knights take a huge advantage at the free throw line, where they went 17 for 21 while BMCC was limited to just 1 of 5.

While the T-Wolves had seven players pick up at least two fouls, the Knights only has three players earn fouls at all.

Moore's second-highest scoring game of the season (her highest was 35 on Dec. 20 vs. South Puget Sound) came with 10 rebounds and three steals. The sophomore guard from Vancouver, Washington, is second the in NWAC in average scoring with 23.25 per game. Whatcom's Kortney Grattic leads the NWAC with 24.53.

Savannah Heugly added 16 points, six rebounds and two blocks for the T-Wolves, which had matched their season-long winning streak by beating Yakima Valley 71-58 on Friday.
