David Michael Jones
Condon
October 31, 1945-January 23, 2015

David Michael Jones, age 69, died peacefully on January 23, 2015, at his home in Condon, Oregon, surrounded by family and close friends. Dave was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in March 2014.

Born October 31, 1945, in Seattle, Washington, to Dorothea and K.C. Jones, he grew up in Diablo, Longview, Tacoma and Pasco, Washington, with his parents and three older sisters. He graduated from Pasco High School in 1963. He then enrolled at the University of Washington, where he earned a bachelor’s degree in history in 1968 and a second bachelor’s degree in zoology in 1970. He was also a member of the U.S. Army Reserves from 1965 until 1971. In 1975 he became one of the early students of the Medex Northwest program for physician assistants (PA) at the University of Washington. He was certified as a PA in 1976 and awarded a third bachelor’s degree in primary health care in 1978. He also earned a master’s degree in physician assistant studies from the University of Nebraska in 2000.

He married Karen Rose Wick in 1969 at St. Luke’s Episcopal Church in Seattle, Washington. They had a son, Tucker, in 1973.

His first position as a PA was as the student health center supervisor at Pacific Lutheran University from 1976-79. He returned to the Medex Northwest program as a faculty member in 1979. In 1980 he moved to Condon, Oregon, with his wife and son to practice. He and Dennis Bruneau, another physician assistant, were the only medical providers in Gilliam County and the first PAs in the country to receive independent prescription-writing authority. He served the Condon community until his death, where he was affectionately known as “Dr. Dave.” He was named Rural PA of the Year by the American Association of Physician Assistants in 1988 and received the award for Outstanding Contributions

to Rural Health in 2008 from the Oregon Rural Health Conference. Dave welcomed generations of new babies

to Condon, caring for the children and grandchildren of his first patients.

He was a volunteer firefighter and emergency medical technician (EMT) from 1970 to 2014. He also served on the Condon School Board, the Oregon Rural Health Coordinating Council, the Oregon Board of Medical Examiners, the Oregon Society of Physician Assistants Board, the Advisory Council for the Oregon Office of Rural Health, the Condon Child Care Board of Trustees, and the Tri-County Home Health Agency Board of Trustees. He was the Gilliam County medical examiner until January 23, 2015.

He is survived by his wife Karen Jones, his son and daughter-in-law Tucker and Stacy Jones, his grandsons Rowan and Harris Jones, his sister and brother-in-law Patricia and Duane Rencken, and many nieces and nephews.

He leaves a legacy of care, compassion and service to rural health and to his community. Seemingly larger than life, Dave’s unique sense of humor and room-filling voice is already greatly missed. He will be remembered by thousands of patients as a trusted advisor and friend, by the medical community as a dedicated educator and ambassador, by his neighbors for his colorful vocabulary, and by his family as a devoted father, grandfather and uncle.

A memorial service will be held at St. John’s Catholic Church on February 7th, 2015, at 11:00 a.m. Family and friends are invited to the parish hall after the service for a potluck luncheon.
