The bogus call came from 1-760-705-8888 and that number is from Google Voice, an app that allows people to use the Internet to make free calls anywhere in the U.S. and Canada.

A caller at 5:30 p.m. reported he heard about the theft and on Wednesday saw a green Honda and red Dodge four-wheel drive and a man in his 50s that could have been "casing" the area.

MILTON-FREEWATER Man heads to trial for attempted murder

A 21-year-old Milton-Freewater man is on the march to trial for trying to murder his ex-girlfriend.

A Umatilla County grand jury Tuesday indicted Ramon Jonathan Leon Gonzalez for attempted murder, first-degree assault, second-degree assault, first-degree burglary, unlawful use of a weapon, menacing and recklessly endangering another person. Court records show he pleaded not guilty to the charges Wednesday during a hearing at the Umatilla County Courthouse, Pendleton. Circuit Court Judge Lynn Hampton set Gonzalez's trial for March 18-20.

Gonzalez on Jan. 22 at about 10:30 p.m. broke

into the apartment of Angelica Campos-Diaz, 21, at 921 Cowl St., Milton-Freewater, and stabbed her twice in the torso and once in the throat, according to Milton-Freewater police Chief Doug Boedigheimer. Officers arrived, heard Gonzalez yelling and found Campos-Diaz bleeding profusely. The estranged couple's 4-year-old child was in the apartment but not injured.

Boedigheimer has reported Campos-Diaz is in good condition and left a Walla Walla hospital. A copy of the indictment shows she and two Milton-Freewater police officers testified to the grand jury.

Gonzalez remains in the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton, in lieu of \$382,000 bail.

Judge to decide if Plute should pay after lawsuit

The verdict is in regarding the lawsuit between Pendleton Plumbing Inc. and Pendleton City Councilman Al Plute. But what the verdict means remains a question.

Pendleton Plumbing, owned and operated by Jeffery "J.T." Dooley and his wife Michelle Dooley, sued Plute and his business interests for more than \$61,000, claiming he had yet to pay for all the work the company did during a renovation from 2009-2012 at the St. George Plaza, a downtown Pendleton business and residential space. Plute's Temple Building Development, a limited liability company that owns the plaza, was also a defendant. Plute then countersued the Dooleys, alleging fraud and misrepresentation. A jury in November 2014 sided with Pendleton Plumbing.

Well, sort of. Attorneys for both parties were back in court Wednesday afternoon in Pendleton and argued for more than two hours about just what the jury decided. Circuit Court Judge Lynn

Hampton presided.

Pendleton attorney Tim O'Hanlon argued for the plumbing company and the Dooleys that the jury found there was an unpaid balance of \$61,111 and a reasonable person would deduce the jury wanted Plute to pay.

Attorney Will Perkinson of Pendleton represented Plute and his interests and said not so fast. The jury verdict form was complicated, he said, and while the jury indeed found there was an unpaid balance, the jury did not actually say if anyone should pay it.

Perkinson also pointed out the only people who could say what the verdict form means were the jurors, and if O'Hanlon had an objection to the verdict he needed to make it when the jury was in court. Once the jury leaves, he said, everyone must live with their findings.

Both sides cited plenty of case law to back their assertions and interpretations, and Judge Hampton said she would sort through it all. It could take a few weeks, though, to reach a decision.
