Phillip Donald Beck, 84, of Pendleton died February 2, 2015, in Richland, Washington. Funeral services will be Thursday, February 12, , at 10:00 a.m. at Pendleton Pioneer Chapel, Folsom-Bishop.

Phillip was born June 18, 1930, in Pilot Rock to Oscar and Ruth (Stubblefield) Beck. He grew up at Battle Mountain State Park and later moved to the southern Oregon coast and helped build Humbug Mountain State Park. He moved back to Pendleton and graduated from Pendleton High School. He remained in Pendleton the rest of his life.

He owned and operated the Phillips 66 Station in Pendleton and worked at the Pilot Rock Lumber Mill in his youth. For 19 years he worked for Independent Dairy and Carnation Dairy while also operating his businesses: an electronics and TV repair business, a Yamaha-guchi motorcycle dealership, and remodeling rental properties. Phil finished his career and most enjoyed his work helping people for 20 years as a realtor with Pendleton Realty.

Phil and Caroline were members of the Presbyterian Church where he was an elder and helped with building the church's youth camp. As

a life-long outdoorsman Phil loved hunting, fishing, wild-life viewing, camping, hiking, water skiing, bicycling, four-wheeling and archery. He enjoyed shooting and was an NRA member. Along with his father, Oscar, as a young father himself, he built a log cabin from hand-cut and peeled logs in the Blue Mountains as a family retreat. Having learned a great deal as a child by "rote" or memorization Phil loved to quote poems and verse along with old adages and was an enthusiastic and accomplished story teller.

Survivors include his wife of 64 years, Caroline Beck of Pendleton; sons Phillip D. Beck Jr. (Stephany) of Spokane and David Beck (Donna) of Pendleton; daughter Linda Petersen of Kennewick; grandchildren Laresa Beck, Ginger Beck-Armstrong, Brian Beck, Jeremy Lundquist, Caroline Lundquist, Alissa Petersen, Candace Jurado and Tera Ryan, and nine great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; brother Eugene Beck and grandson Flint Beck.
