Jim and Mary retired from farming in 1979, at which time Mary began working as a typist for the Simmons-Fisher Insurance Agency in Hermiston, a job she kept until 1988. In April 2014 Mary sold her home on Loop Road and moved to Sun Terrace.

She was a member of the Loop Road Harmony Club

from 1949 until she moved into Sun Terrace. Mary was an accomplished bookkeeper, gardener, seamstress and pianist, and always had something on hand to eat whenever anyone dropped by. She enjoyed reading and crossword puzzles.

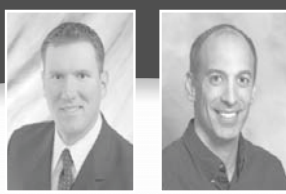
