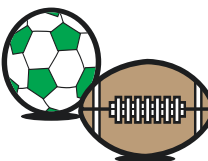

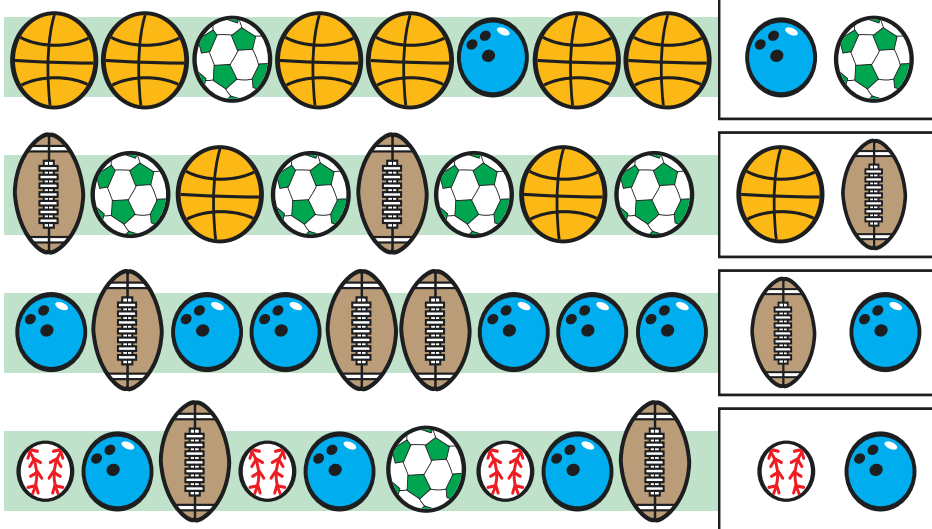
Newspaper Flag Grab

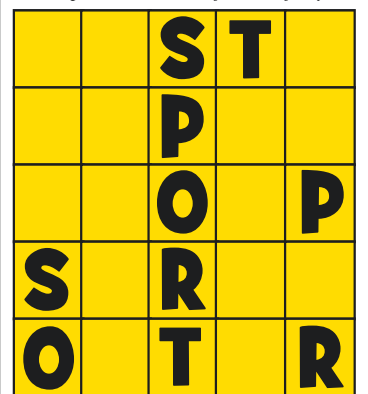
