New officers, dispatchers come to local agencies

SALEM — New police officers and dispatchers are headed to Eastern Oregon agencies after graduating with state certifications.

Mario Cobian will be a rookie for the Hermiston Police Department, and Kaleb Crowell is the latest member of the Morrow County Sheriff's Office. The two graduated with 38 other new officers Feb. 20 from the basic police class at Oregon Public Safety Academy, Salem. The class is 16 weeks long and covers dozens of training areas, including survival skills, firearms, and cultural diversity.

New officers also have months of training in the field before operating solo.

Four graduates of the safety academy's latest basic telecommunications class for dispatchers also are headed this way: Laura Grazier with the Umatilla County Sheriff's Office; Megan Hoel with the Milton-Freewater Police Department; and Whitney Sitton and Gina Wilson with the Morrow County Sheriff's Office.

They are among 24 classmates that consisted of public safety communications professionals from 9-1-1/emergency communications centers statewide. The two-week course includes emergency call handling techniques, stress management and more. After returning, they continue training for a number of months with a field training officer.

Woman pleads not guilty for OSU pornographic video

CORVALLIS (AP) — The 19-year-old woman who appears in a pornographic video recorded in the Oregon State University library pleaded not guilty Thursday in Corvallis to a charge of public indecency. Former student Kendra Sunderland admits she's in the video that was recorded in October and posted on the Internet in January. But her lawyer, Mike Flinn, told KEZI somebody else recorded it without her consent.

The video shows her

undressing at a table.

Sunderland says she regrets the video but is making the best of it. She signed an autograph for a fan as she left the courthouse.

Fake water worker suspected in Portland burglary

PORTLAND (AP) — The Portland Water Bureau says residents can ask to see a badge or call to verify if a worker is truly an employee before letting them in your home.

Residents are on alert after an 82-year-old man was burglarized Saturday when a man in an orange vest came to his door, claiming to be checking on reports of brown water in the area.

KATU reports the homeowner let him into the house and spent 15 minutes in the basement checking the faucets.

After the man left, the homeowner noticed someone had rummaged through a desk.

Woman knocked out by egging

SEATTLE (AP) — Police say a woman was knocked unconscious when she was pelted by an egg in a so-called drive-by egging.

Detective Patrick Michaud says the egg hit the woman right behind the ear and knocked her out early Tuesday. Her friends caught her before she fell to the ground and drove her to a local hospital.

Police say the woman and her friends were standing outside a bar in the Crown Hill neighborhood when someone in a passing truck threw a volley of eggs at them. An employee of the bar was also hit in the egging.
