William P. "Bill" Faucett, a Pendleton resident, died Tuesday evening, March 3, 2015, at his home. He was 91 years old.

He served his country in combat at Bougainville, Okinawa and Ryukyu Islands during WWII. He received an honorable discharge from the USMC on November 14, 1945.

On December 21, 1945, he married Meldia M. Hubbard. They had four children. Meldia preceded him in death in 1975. He married

his second wife Laura Belle McMichael in 1976.

William worked several places and retired from the Oregon State Highway Department in 1985. He enjoyed woodworking, fishing and spending time with family.

Bill Faucett is survived by three children: Stella Yarbrough of Meridian, Idaho, Lee R. Faucett of Woodbridge, Va., and Anna Sellers of Frankfort, Ind.; three stepchildren: Larry McMichael of Prineville, Ore., Terry McMichael of Pendleton, Ore., and Sandy Spicher of Pueblo, Colo.; grandchildren Tammy Kaplan of Smithfield, Va., and William Faucett of Germany; eight stepgrandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren, 14 stepgreat-grandchildren, two great-great-grandchildren, and eight stepgreat-great-grandchildren.
