Geneva obtained her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Colorado in 1932. She was also a member of Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society. She married Murl McJunkin on June 4th, 1941, in Provo, Utah, and soon after moved to Pendleton, Oregon. She raised two children, Ann and Myron, and at age 70 began raising her grandson Todd McJunkin.

Larry Moore died peacefully Tuesday in Salem in the presence of his family.

Born in Heppner, Oregon, he graduated from Pendleton High School in 1939 and obtained his private pilot's license the summer after graduation. He attended Oregon State University. Larry was a Pilot of B-17's in World War II and ultimately became a flight and radar instructor. Larry married Rosemary ("Rosie") Monasterelli in July of 1944 after requesting a three-day pass from his post.

After the war he pursued his interest in a "stationers" (aka office products) career and worked in Eugene and Salem, eventually co-owning Commercial Business Supply. After many years of long hours and caring for customers, Larry retired in 1991 and easily transitioned to a life of retirement.

Larry was active in the community as evidenced by his roles as past president of organizations such as: Salem and Oregon Jaycees, Salem Chamber of Commerce, Salem Downtown Association, Oregon Retail Council, NW Wholesale Stationers, and a number of other organizations to promote the Salem community, its downtown, and local business owners.

Larry was also an active member of many civic organizations such as The Knights of Columbus, American Legion, Elks, Lions, Illahee Hills Country Club, St. Vincent de Paul Parish, the Oregon State Alumni Association and the OSU Beaver Club, among others.

Larry lost his sweet Ros-
