PHS grad returns from medical mission trip

Dr. Richard Wick, a 2004 Pendleton High School graduate, recently took part in a medical mission to Lambayeque, Peru, with the Foundation for the Advancement of Cleft Education and Services (F.A.C.E.S.), a Portland based charity. While on the seven-day mission he served as one of three anesthesiologists to help perform 47 surgeries including repairs of cleft lips and palates for children in the region. Wick had previously traveled to Peru for a mission while he was a medical student at Creighton University in 2009.

Wick graduated from Gonzaga University in 2008 and from Creighton Medical School in 2012. He is entering his final year of residency in anesthesiology at Oregon Health and Science University, one of 12 residents chosen from over 1,000 applicants across the country to complete the four-year program. He was recently elected chief resident for the 2015-2016 academic year and aims to practice in the Northwest after completing his training.
