The state contest will be held Friday at Western University in Monmouth. Ruiz-Nino was one of 100 top-scoring students in Oregon invited to compete in the state geography bee.

Each state champion

will receive \$100, the "National Geographic Atlas of the World, 10th Edition," a medal, and a trip to Washington, D.C., to compete in the National Geographic Bee Championship at the National Geographic Society headquarters May 11-13. Winners of the national bee will receive a \$50,000 scholarship, lifetime membership in the National Geographic Society and an all-expenses-paid trip to the Galapagos Islands with a parent or guardian.

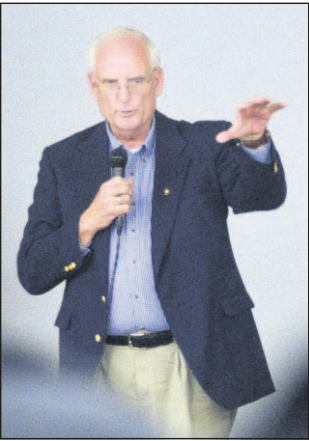
