MONTEREY, Calif. — Justin Schumacher, regional preparedness liaison with the Oregon Health Authority, completed a Master of Arts degree in security studies at the Naval Postgraduate School Center for Homeland Defense and Security on March 27.

Schumacher has held numerous positions in emergency management and disaster response in several states, most recently in Pendleton, Oregon, and around the Northwest. He is currently in training for his next assignment with the U.S. State Department's Diplomatic Security Service.

During the 18-month online and in-residence program, Schumacher collaborated with homeland se-

curity officials from across the nation on current policy, strategy and organizational design challenges. He wrote a thesis titled "The Less We Know: The Utility of Uncertainty and Ambiguity in Counterterrorism."

CHDS, located at the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), is the nation's homeland security educator. Master's degree students develop critical thinking, leadership and policy skills during a rigorous 18-month program. Each graduate completes a thesis on a current issue facing his/her jurisdiction. These theses often translate into policy and practice. The CHDS is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), National Preparedness Directorate, within the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).
