Marjorie Champion Mandelkorn, a longtime resident of Pendleton, passed away on Easter Sunday, April 5, 2015, in Tigard, OR. She was 100 years old.

Marjorie was born on November 18, 1914, in Kansas City, the third of Will and Amelia Burgess' eight children. She grew up on a farm near Chula, MO, and in 1938, she married the love of her life, Charles V. Champi-

on, from Illinois. Following World War II, Charles and Marjorie moved west and settled in Pendleton at a home on McKay Creek south of town, where they raised three children, John, Jane, and David. Marge, as she was known to her friends, lost Charles to an early death

in 1967, but in 1975, she met her second husband, retired Rear Admiral Richard Mandelkorn, while on a trail ride in the Colorado Rockies. They were married the following year and Marjorie moved to Santa Fe, NM, where they spent seven happy years together prior to Richard's death in 1982. Marge continued to live in Santa Fe until 1998, when she moved to Tucson, AZ, and then to Tigard, OR, in 2011. Marjorie is survived by her daughter, Jane Cooney, of Portland, OR, her son David Champion, of Lopez Island, WA, and her two younger brothers, Arthur, of Lawrence, KS, and John, of Raytown, MO.
