Gary was born June 11, 1952, to Robert and Ellen (Fraser) Brown in Pendleton. They lived in Stanfield and Hermiston, graduating from Hermiston High in 1970 with an aptitude for the sciences. He attended Eastern Oregon State College, now EOU, graduating in 1975 with a chemistry degree and again in 1982 with a business degree. His work experience included Martin Marietta aluminum in The Dalles, Borden Chemical/Hexion in La Grande as their analytical chemist, quality assurance specialist and management trainer for 30 years, traveling extensively in the U.S., Canada, the UK and Australia. Gary was a private, soft-spoken and kind-hearted man. He had a quiet intensity for family, work and fun.

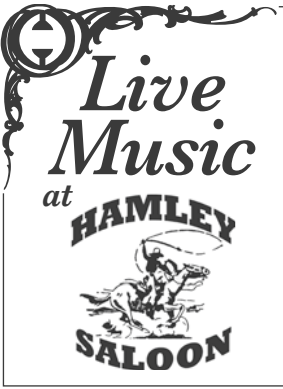

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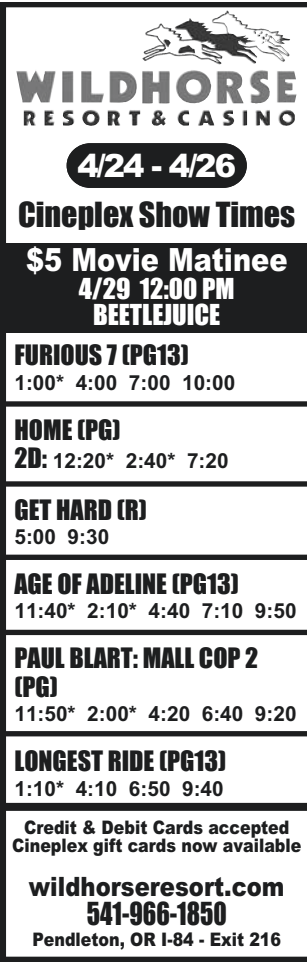
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
