ATHENA — Weston-McEwen earned its first Special District 6 victory and ended a nine-game slump with a doubleheader split with league leading Pilot Rock. After the Rockets took the first game 6-2 behind Jacob Pierce's heroics at the plate, the TigerScots rebounded to earn a 1-0 victory in the second.

Weston-McEwen (4-13, 1-5 SD) recorded just one hit, a Vince Roff single, but pitcher Sutter Ball kept the Rockets (11-7, 5-1 SD6) from getting on the board to snap out of the losing ways.

Ball allowed just five base runners, but none reached home plate. Garrett Shell scored the lone, reaching on a walk before coming home on a Hunter Sater RBI.

UNION — Kristi Childers dominated the hurdles and the Mac-Hi girls track team placed second at the Pepsi Invitational on Saturday in Union.

Childers won 100-meter hurdles (16.75) and the 300 hurdles (50.29) for the team's only individual wins.

Also strong for the Pioneer girls were Amber Wells (3rd javelin, 106-6; 3rd triple jump, 31-3.5; 4th discus, 82-4) and Alicia Walter (2nd pole vault, 7-0).

Union won the team title with 118.5 points and Mac-Hi finished with 90. Helix was fifth with 50.

Tegan Jackson had Helix's only win of the afternoon in discus (102-10) and teammate Makenzie Mize was second (96-4). Jackson was also second in shot put (33-8) while Mize was third (32-7).

The only other local girl to win an event was Heppner's Kelly Wilson in long jump (14-2.5).

Enterprise won the boys' team title with 115.5 points.

a good home meet. The girls placed three Bulldogs in the top five of the shot put, one Bulldog earned a top five finish in the discus and two were in the top six of the javelin.

Jazzmin Gutierrez took top honors in the girls shot put at 34-07, edging Tabitha Wellsandt of Kamiakin by four inches. Noa Ena (33-00.50) finished third and freshman Maddy Juul (33-07) was fifth.

"The three girls in the shot competed," said throws coach David Faaeteete said. "They maybe didn't throw their best, but they just competed and conteded all the way through it."

Umatilla sprinter Amie Zitterkob hasn't cooled or slowed down. The Eastern Oregon

University-bound Viking won the girls 100 meter and 200 meter sprints Saturday, clocking a 12.68 time in the 100 and 25.71 in the 200, a Umatilla school record. Zitterkob's 100 time edged Hermiston's Audrey Lincoln by just five one-hundredths of a second, and the 200 spread was a little larger: nearly three tenths over Pasco's Angela Cardon.

Zitterkob was humble after the blistering 200 time on her favorite track.

"It was a good day," she said. "I felt comfortable and relaxed. I was glad the sun came out. It was cold and wet during the 100 meter. Once the sun came out, things were good. I want to continue to focus on improving."
