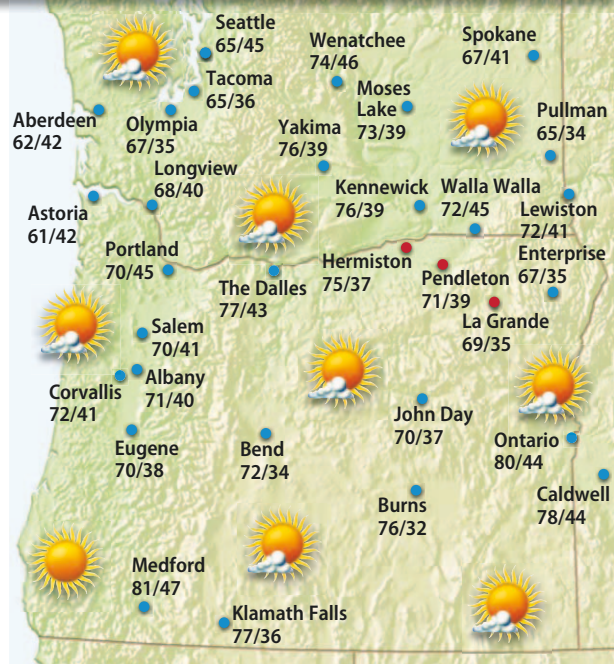

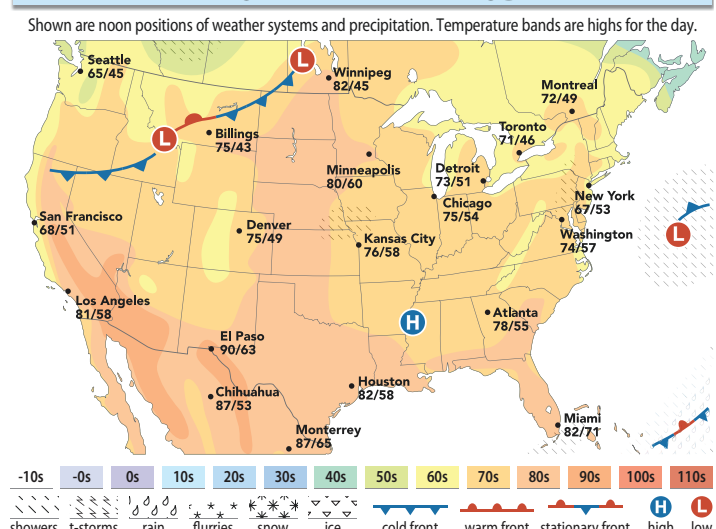

Boardman moves to regulate medical marijuana

The city of Boardman has new rules in place for permitting medical marijuana dispensaries, with an emphasis on keeping the businesses away from areas where children typically gather.

Regulations were approved by the Boardman City Council at a special meeting Tuesday, April 28. A year-long moratorium on dispensaries expired Friday.

Ordinance No. 4-2015 provides two commercial sub-districts where dispensaries will be allowed, and adds language to the city's development code for medical marijuana shops, such as setting hours of operation and limiting the size of signs.

Dispensaries will not be allowed within 1,000 feet of schools, playgrounds, churches and bus stops, which have already been designated as "minor children safety zones" in an ordinance passed by the city council on March 17.

Community Development Director Barry Beyeler said the regulations only apply to medical marijuana facilities, and not to recreational marijuana, which was legalized by Oregon voters last year. The Oregon Liquor Control Commission is in charge of writing rules for recreational marijuana business licenses, and Beyeler said it remains unclear just what the agency plans to do.

Nobody has approached the city yet about opening a medical marijuana dispensary, but Beyeler said officials didn't want to wait.

"We just needed to put some form of governance to it before we had an application," he said.

Boardman, along with all other jurisdictions in Morrow County, enacted a moratorium on dispensaries in 2014 after the legislature passed Senate Bill 1531. Over the next year, the city worked to come up with rules on when, where and how the businesses could operate.

The ordinance approved Tuesday by the city council will allow dispensaries in two sub-districts: tourist commercial (along Interstate 84) and

service center (near the Port of Morrow interchange). Dispensaries must also obtain a conditional use permit in order to operate in city limits. Conditions include no on-site consumption of marijuana, and no outdoor storage of the product. Business signs cannot be larger than 100 square feet, and all businesses must be licensed by the Oregon Health Authority.

Dispensaries cannot be open longer than eight hours on weekdays, and six hours on weekends and holidays. They must close by 8 p.m. on weekdays and 6 p.m. on weekends.

In addition, grow operations must be kept indoors, screened and ventilated to control odor.

Beyeler said the purpose behind the "minor children safety zones" is to create safe and accommodating places for kids, which should be reflected by what businesses are allowed in those areas.
