William C. Ferguson (Bill), 87, died on May 31, 2015, at Marquis Shaw Mountain Hospice Care Facility in Boise, Idaho, after a short battle with cancer.

Bill is survived by his wife, Connie (Joseph) and children Sue Fraser of Boise, Idaho, Debbie Benz of Scappoose, Ore., and Jon Ferguson of Bend, Ore. Bill was blessed with two grandchildren, Jenny Doster of Boise, Idaho, and Danny Fraser (deceased). Bill has three beautiful great-grandchildren in Boise,

Kaitlyn, Carson and Madelyn.

Several years into retirement, Bill and Connie came home to Wallowa County in 1998 to enjoy their friends, beautiful country, hunting and fishing they both loved so much.
