Wildhorse Foundation announces grant awards

The Wildhorse Foundation hosted its annual Recipients Luncheon May 6 in Rivers Events Center at Wildhorse Resort & Casino. During the gathering they announced the first quarter grants, which included a top award of \$15,000 to **Ione Rural Fire Protection District** to purchase self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) and spare cylinders.

The quarterly awards totaled \$191,971.17, which was awarded to 33 recipients. Other local entities receiving grants include:

PENDLETON: Arts Council of Pendleton, \$700 for the Learning Younger Program; **Blue Mountain Community College Foundation**, \$7,500 for a linear move irrigation system at the BMCC Ag Farm; **city of Pendleton**, \$8,000 for SCBA and fit test machine; **CTUIR Public Works Department**, \$5,000 for chairs for the Longhouse; **Pendleton Round-Up Association**, \$7,300 to install underground cables and provide spider boxes for electrical services to teepees; **Pendleton Youth Football**, \$5,000 for football equipment and helmet replacement; **Sunridge Middle School**, \$5,000 for a Chrome Book Lab; **Tonya's House, Inc.**, \$5,000 to replace front porch and stairs; **Umatilla County Historical Society**, \$1,000 to support the operating budget during the Bargain Counter's first year of operation at its new location.

HERMISTON: Desert View Elementary School, \$5,000 for iPad minis for second grade classrooms; **Highland Hills Elementary School**, \$5,000 to create iPad learning stations for each first and third grade classroom; **Kiwanis Club of Hermiston**, \$2,500 for iCanBike program; **Umatilla-Morrow County Head Start**, \$4,700 for car seats for low income families.

ATHENA: Athena-Weston School District, \$3,050.64 for

Balance Ball Chairs to improve focus of children in the classroom; **city of Athena**, \$10,000 for repairs at the municipal pool.

BOARDMAN: Columbia River Community Health Services, \$7,500 for public defibrillators; **Riverside High School**, \$5,934.17 for the course and materials to teach 3D printing and manufacturing skills class.

HELIX: Helix Park & Recreation District, \$10,000 to repair flood damage at the park; **Helix School District**, \$10,000 for iPads and accessories for kindergarten-fifth grade.

MILTON-FREEWATER: Milton-Freewater Cemetery Maintenance District, \$5,000 for paving and asphalt to improve access to gravesites.

PILOT ROCK: Pilot Rock Rural Fire Protection District, \$7,500 for public defibrillators.

WESTON: Blue Mountain (Kees) Cemetery, \$2,000 to repair memorials in the cemetery; **city of Weston**, \$5,000 to repair the roof at city hall.

OTHER AREAS: Advantage Smiles for Kids, city of Joseph, Greater Enterprise Main Streets Group, Hurricane Creek Grange, Island City Elementary School, Joseph Volunteer Fire Department, North Powder Valley Charter School, Special Olympics Oregon Union County and Time of Remembrance.

The foundation manages a community benefit fund established by the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation from its gaming operation. The board considers grant applications in the areas of public health and safety, education, the arts, historic preservation, gambling addiction services, salmon restoration, environmental protection and cultural activities.
