Having taken photos and measurements of the original model of Mount Everest displayed at REI, her den then recreated the scale model, which was then used as the centerpiece, to much garnered attention.

In the fall of 1992, Barbara and Bill were able to realize the American dream when they purchased the supermarket in Umatilla, Oregon, where she was a bookkeeper. Having remodeled the store and naming it Columbia Red Apple Market, they operated within this format for the following 12 years. In 2008, they again remodeled the store to become Columbia Harvest Foods. Barbara again worked in the same capacity of bookkeeper, having retired in 2010.

A loving wife, mother and grandmother, Barbara is survived by her husband of 56 years, Bill; sons David Meade and wife Julie of Hermiston and Mitchell "Russ" Meade and wife Sara of Umatilla; her two grandsons, Calvin and Cameron Meade of Hermiston; her granddaughter Ashley Snow and husband Kyle of Stanfield; and her sister Kathy Cavallo of Pendleton, along with various nieces and nephews.
