Southern Cross conservation easement would protect fish and wildlife habitat

The Bonneville Power Administration intends to fund the purchase of a conservation easement on approximately 542 acres of riparian habitat located along Catherine Creek in Union County, Ore. When the transaction is complete, the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation will own and manage the property for fish and wildlife conservation purposes and grant BPA a conservation easement over the property to ensure that the habitat values on the property are always protected.

Funding for the purchase of the easement is part of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation's 2008 Accord agreement with BPA and its federal agency partners. These agreements established firm 10-year funding commitments to Accord partners for habitat and hatchery actions. Funding is being provided as part of BPA's ongoing efforts to protect, restore and enhance habitat for Snake River spring-summer chinook and steelhead as mitigation for the construction and operation of the Federal Columbia River Power System on the Columbia and Snake rivers.

The Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation will develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat on the property. BPA will review the plan for consistency with the mitigation and conservation purposes of the acquisition.
