ARRESTS, CITATIONS

- A pair of Milton-Freewater teens found out Oregon’s new recreational marijuana law does not extend to juveniles.
- An Oregon State Police trooper stopped a Honda Civic for not having headlights on at 10:36 p.m. at Highway 339 and Northwest Eight Avenue, Milton-Freewater. The trooper smelled marijuana in the car, and the 18-year-old driver handed over a small bud. The trooper than found another roughly 3.5 ounces of pot.
- Measure 91, which went into effect July 1, allows people 21 and older to possess certain amounts of marijuana. The trooper therefore arrested the driver, Jose Oliva of Milton-Freewater, for possession of pot, and cited the 17-year-old male passenger for the same.

Court: Cops need more than general concern to ask about guns

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon Supreme Court says police must have a good reason to ask people they stop if they have a weapon.

The high court Thursday threw out an unlawful-weapon conviction of a 19-year-old man who was stopped for jaywalking by an Oregon State Police trooper in Portland.

The trooper asked Joseph Lucio Jimenez if he had any weapons on him, and Jimenez said he had a gun.

Citing “officer safety reasons,” the officer said he always asks pedestrians he stops if they have weapons. The Supreme

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Bowerman indicted on new teen sex abuse charges

Nearly a year after her first arrest for allegedly sexually abusing one of her teenage athletes, a former Madras High School track coach has been indicted on charges involving the same boy in another county.

Melissa Bowerman, 44, of Fossil, was indicted by a grand jury last week on two counts of second-degree sexual abuse of a minor male on her track team in Deschutes County between May and July of last year, court records show.

Bowerman, a daughter-in-law of Nike co-founder Bill Bowerman, was first arrested in July 2014 on allegations she’d abused the teen, who was 17 years old at the time, in Jefferson County. She was released from jail to live with her husband, Jon Bowerman, in August 2014.

Jefferson County District Attorney Steve Leriche, who court records show has been specially appointed to prosecute

the case in Deschutes County, declined to comment on the case Thursday.

“This is not a new revelation,” said Bowerman’s attorney, Stephen Houze, on Thursday.

Melissa Bowerman’s stepdaughter, Liz Russell, first reported to police last summer her concerns that Bowerman was having a sexual relationship with a student on her team, according to a probable cause affidavit filed by an Oregon State Police detective last year.

Bowerman and the boy were reportedly messaging each other via Facebook and engaged in sexual behavior.

She sent him naked photos of herself and asked him to have sex, according to the affidavit.

In 2013, Bowerman was dismissed from a volunteer coaching job with the Condon/Wheeler track team after she escorted a student to prom.

Bowerman is scheduled to enter a plea in the Deschutes County case on Sept. 2, 12 days before her trial is scheduled to begin in Jefferson County.

Goodwill to open in old movie theater

It turns out all the old Pendleton movie theater needs is a little Goodwill.

Following the conversion of the old Hermiston Cinema to a Goodwill thrift store and collection center, the recently purchased Pendleton Cinema will do the same.

Having bought the whole block, Gordon Comfort, the executive director of Goodwill Industries of the Columbia, said the organization plans to use both the cinema and the DG Gifts building.

Comfort expects to open the new store during the first quarter of 2016.

Unlike Hermiston, this will be the first time Goodwill will have a perma-

nent presence in Pendleton.

Comfort said Goodwill previously installed a collection center in the Wal-Mart parking lot to determine whether Pendleton could meet the level of donations that would keep a store sustainable.

Not only did Pendletonians donate enough to support the store, but many explicitly requested Goodwill install a location.

When Goodwill officials struck a deal with Bruce Humphrey, the owner of both the Pendleton and Hermiston cinemas, those donors got their wish.

Goodwill Industries of the Columbia was incorporated as an independent member agency in 1969 and oversees several stores in northeastern Washington and Oregon.

Police arrest 10 at fishing company

PORTLAND — The owners of a Depoe Bay charter fishing company are among 10 people who face racketeering charges following an investigation into a scheme involving fishing licenses, the Oregon State Police said Friday.

Julie Harmon, 51, and Tim Harmon, 67, owners of Tradewinds Charters, were booked into the Lincoln County Jail in Newport this week after the grand jury returned an indictment July 2. Also arrested were six boat captains and two other employees.

Oregon State Lt. Bill Fugate said the defendants charged customers for daily angling licenses, but they pocketed the money instead of buying licenses from the state Department of Fish and Wildlife. The customers were never given actual licenses, he said.

Investigators executed a search warrant in March at the company’s Depoe Bay headquarters. According to the search warrant affidavit, Trooper Heather Van Meter first heard four years ago that Tradewinds was charging customers for one-day licenses but not providing them. Witnesses, including a former deckhand, later said the company often gave customers only a paper receipt.

The affidavit says police troopers twice went undercover. In the first instance, a trooper without a shellfish license was able to pull two crab pots. The second time, two troopers reported getting only paper receipts after paying.

Tim Harmon, from Lake Oswego, said in a statement first provided to *The Oregonian* that the arrests stem from a misunderstanding and the company has never done anything intentionally wrong. The Harmons’ attorney, Richard Sause, said he had nothing to add.
