The U.S. Navy wants your input!

The U.S. Navy, in cooperation with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP), Oregon State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), and Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR), has prepared a Draft Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to complete National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 consultation for the proposed actions contained in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for ongoing and proposed military readiness activities at Naval Weapons Systems Training Facility (NWSTF) Boardman.

The proposed action may have an adverse effect on historic properties of religious and cultural significance eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places at NWSTF Boardman.

Stipulations of the Draft MOA to minimize potential adverse effects that are being considered by the parties are: develop a monitoring plan for historic properties on NWSTF Boardman; develop education and training materials for personnel using the range, and implement specific actions to protect known historic properties.
