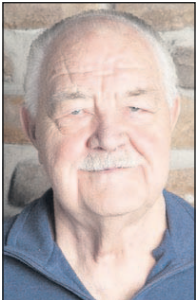
He is survived by sons Dan (Susan) of Lehi, Utah, and son Craig of Pioche, Nevada, four grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.
