EO-7809 LEGAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION AND SOLICITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT TEN CENT COMMUNITY WILDFIRE PROTECTION PROJECT, UMATILLA AND WALLOWA-WHITMAN NATIONAL FORESTS

The North Fork John Day Ranger District is soliciting public comments on the revised proposed Ten Cent Community Wildfire Protection Project. This project is located in the Granite Creek Watershed on the Umatilla and Wallowa-Whitman National Forests. The project area is approximately 38,000 acres. The project area is located in the following Township and Ranges; Southeast corner of Township 8, South Range 34 East, South half of Township 8 South Range 35 East, South half of Township 8 South Range 35 _ East, Southwest corner of Township 8 South Range 36 East, East half of Township 9 South Range 34 East, all of Township 9 South Range 35 East, all but Southeast corner of Township 9 South Range 35 _ East and the western half of Township 9 South Range 36 East Willamette Meridian. The project area is located in Grant County, Oregon.

The purpose and need of the Ten Cent Community Wildfire Protection Project is to provide a safer working environment for firefighters while improving probability of success in protecting life and property associated with the adjacent private lands in the event of a wildfire within or threatening the values at risk in the Granite Zone as defined by the Grant County Community Wildfire Protection Plan. This includes the city of Granite, the city of Greenhorn, the scattered inholdings, and the egress routes from the identified values at risk. The need is to modify the existing fuels to reduce potential fire behavior to low intensity and reduce the probability of crown fire and spotting. There is also a need to maintain and enhance local communities and economies by providing a diversity of resource management activities, recreational opportunities, commodity outputs, and ecosystem services from public lands. The overall need for the Ten Cent Community Wildfire Protection Project is to modify the predicted fire behavior in the project area while supporting local communities by providing goods and services.

The Forest Service proposes actions within the project area to respond to the purpose and need for action. Multiple types of fuel reduction treatments would occur across these stands and would be designed to increase tree spacing and reduce surface fuels. The treatments would include a mixture of commercial and non-commercial logging and prescribed burning. These treatments would occur along the private land boundaries and extend up to 1.5 miles away from those boundaries, where indicated by predicted fire behavior. The goal would be to create a contiguous Defensible Fuel Profile Zone (DFPZ) along all private land borders within the project area. Strategic DFPZs would also be placed along roads and the forest stands within these zones would be treated a maximum of 500 feet from both sides of the road as necessary. The width of treatment would be dictated by current stand conditions as well as other resource management needs. The goal of these roadside treatments would be DFPZs that help facilitate safe evacuation of residents and public in the event of a wildfire, slow the progress of a wildfire coming out of the North Fork John Day Wilderness, and provide firefighters a higher probability of successfully managing a wildfire.

On March 27, 2013, a final rule revising 36 CFR Part 218 was published in the Federal Register and became effective on that date. The new rule replaces the previous appeal rules defined in 36 CFR 215, and expands the use of the pre-decisional objection process used for projects authorized under the Healthy Forests Restoration Act of 2003. The new rule provides the public an opportunity to comment and express concerns on projects before decisions are made, rather than after. The comment period for this proposed action is intended to provide those interested in or affected by this proposal an opportunity to make their concerns known during this revised project. Those who provide comments or express an interest in a particular proposed action by the close of the comment period will be eligible to use the pre-decisional objection process used for projects authorized under the 36 CFR Part 218. We asked for public comment in 2014 regarding an early concept of this project, and have since refined our proposed action. EO-7808 LEGAL NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION AND SOLICITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT GRANITE-DESOLATION AQUATIC RESTORATION PROJECT NORTH FORK JOHN DAY RANGER DISTRICT, UMATILLA NATIONAL FOREST

The North Fork John Day District Ranger is soliciting public comments on the proposed Granite-Desolation Aquatic Restoration Project between Dale and Granite in Grant County, Oregon. The proposed action includes aquatic restoration, instream work, meadow restoration, pre-commercial thinning, riparian planting, and road decommissioning. Meadow treatments proposed include small instream structures, revegetation with native plants, thinning encroaching conifers, cattle fencing and relocating spring developments. The Granite and Desolation Creek watersheds are the District's highest priority for aquatic restoration and the objective is to improve aquatic habitat conditions in those watersheds. This project would reduce sediment delivery from 129 miles of roads, upgrade 8 culverts on fish-bearing streams increasing connectivity on 20 stream miles, enhance 265 acres of wet meadow habitat, and increase habitat complexity on almost 100 stream miles. Of 129 miles of proposed road treatments, only 1.3 miles of roads currently open to motorized use are proposed to be decommissioned. These would be 0.4 miles of the 5505-200 road and 0.9 miles of the 1030-020 road.
