# Dozens near wildfires ordered to evacuate

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon Department of Transportation closed Interstate 84 in both directions between Pendleton and Ontario for much of Thursday evening due to a wildfire.

The closure comes as residents of 57 homes in the area were under evacuation orders and dozens more were told to be ready to leave because of the fire burning near Baker City.

highway closure lasted until about 8 p.m.

Gov. Kate Brown invoked the Emergency Conflagration Act just before 3:30 a.m., mobilizing fire crews from across the state to protect the threatened structures

Crews were on their way

from Yamill, Clatsop and Columbia counties, said Jamie Knight, an Oregon Department of Forestry spokeswoman. As of Wednesday night, the fire had charred 20 square miles. There were no reports of structural damage, Knight said.

"Fuels are very dry," she said. "They're in tough terrain with dry fuels and tough weather conditions, so all those things are lending themselves to the fire behavior that we've been experiencing and are expecting to experience."

Between that fire and another nearby blaze, 57 homes were under immediate evacuation orders, 47 were told to be ready to go at a

moment's notice, and 41 are in areas that could become threatened, said Stefanie Kirby with Baker County Emergency Management.

Meanwhile, officials sa U.S. Highway 26 through Warm Springs has reopened to traffic after having been closed Wednesday because of fire. Sparks from an RV's trailer that lost a wheel ignited over a half-dozen fires along the highway on the Warm Springs Indian Reservation, KTVZ reported.

A double-wide home was destroyed, and evacuation orders were issued for several areas, said Clay Penhollow, spokesman for the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs.

**Case Update** 

You may have seen a previous notice in this case. The Oregon state rule on unclaimed money in class actions has recently changed, and your rights may be affected.

People who did not previously receive a letter about this case. file a claim, or opt out of this lawsuit may need to take action. If this applies to you, you must file a claim or opt-out of this lawsuit to preserve your rights. Any money that is not claimed will be paid to Oregon Legal Services and an entity (or entities) chosen by the Court.

What is this case about? An Oregon jury found that BP West Coast Products LLC ("BPWCP") charged more for gas than the amount registered at the pump and failed to properly disclose its prices when it charged a 35-cent fee to consumers who used debit cards to pay for gas at Oregon ARCO stations and ampm locations. BPWCP has denied the claims in this case and plans to appeal the jury verdict.

Am I eligible to file a claim? You can file a claim now if:

- You purchased gas at Oregon ARCO or ARCO ampm locations between January 1, 2011 and August 30, 2013 and paid a 35-cent debit card transaction fee,
- You did not receive a letter about the lawsuit,
- You did not already file a claim, and
- You did not opt-out.

If you already received a letter about this case, do not file a claim because you will receive an automatic payment.

How can I file a claim? File a claim online or by mail by **September 21, 2015**. If you file a valid claim, you will be eligible to receive \$164.85 or more, and you will give up your right to individually sue BPWCP for the claims in this case. The previous notice talked about a \$200 payment, but the fees required to pay Class Counsel will reduce payments by \$35.15.

### What are my other rights?

If eligible, you may also:

- Exclude yourself (or opt-out) online or by mail from the lawsuit by September 21, 2015. You will keep your right to sue BPWCP yourself.
- Object to the notice or claims process (or the fees if you file a claim now) by **September 18, 2015**. · Do nothing. If you did not previously take action and now
- do not file a claim or exclude yourself, you will give up your right to get any money from this lawsuit and your right to sue BPWCP yourself.

## Federal audit says BPA wasted \$5.2 million on nixed software

federal audit says the Bonneville Power Administration spent millions on hiring software that was later replaced.

An audit released by the U.S. Department of Energy's Inspector General says \$5.2 million was wasted on hiring software that the Portland-based power marketing agency stopped using in June 2014, the Oregonian reported.

Tacoma-based Technologies was contracted to provide the software in 2012. Chief executive Linda

Rix said the audit was "flat out inaccurate."

"We had the thought that maybe this was a form of retaliation," Rix said. "It's not dissimilar from the other report in that it is not well researched or well founded. I'm not sure this is directed as much at us as it is the procurement function within BPA."

Avue criticized a 2013 Inspector General investigation into complaints that said Bonneville was discouraging hiring veterans.

Power Bonneville

officials say they did not commission Avue's analysis of that investigation, and administrator Elliot Mainzer said in a statement responding to the recent audit the agency is implementing changes.

"We are committed to addressing the remaining weaknesses in our procurement practices and establishing first rate purchasing procedures and IT program management, which are critical to maintaining the region's trust to carry out its mission," Mainzer said.

### **Benton County man dies** from West Nile virus

OLYMPIA, Wash. (AP) — State health officials say a Benton County man has died from West Nile virus, the first such death this year in Washington.

The Department of Health said Thursday that the man in his 80s was likely exposed to the virus near his home. He was hospitalized before he died.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is testing to confirm the infection.

Ten others in Washington have been diagnosed with West Nile virus infection, with most of them in Benton County.

### **Coast Guard finds missing** boat with 4 onboard

WINCHESTER BAY (AP) — Coast Guard crews have found a boat with two children and two adults onboard after it went missing off Winchester Bay in Oregon.

Petty Officer Katelyn Shearer says Tennessee residents Jim Jackson, Michael Jackson and two children, 10 and 14, were found by a Coast Guard helicopter a day after the boat was due.

Shearer says the four are tired and thirsty, but otherwise OK. The 25-foot boat left Coos Bay at 8 a.m. Wednesday to fish for crab. It was due back in a few hours, but didn't show.
